Missions for February

Friends of the Homeless Shelter Projects

The Friends of the Homeless Shelter provides a safe comfortable place for those who are experiencing difficult times and need temporary shelter during their transition to becoming independent.

Homelessness in our community is a problem. We have people living under bridges, in cars and on the streets with no where to go.



The shelter provides a place to go for shelter, a hot meal and a hot cup of coffee.

The shelter usually operates to capacity of 36 people with a waiting list of 10 to 20 people. They do what they can to make parents with children a priority, but are limited by space restrictions.

The mission committee is asking you to support the mission of the month which is Homeless Shelter Projects.

We have been in contact with the Administrative Assistant at the Homeless Shelter. She has requested assistance for projects this year. Starting with welcome bags for children coming into the shelter. They are divided by age group, age 0-1, age 2-8, age 9-12, and age 13-17. There were 40 children that went through the shelter last year.

A Tour of Biblical Proportions

Kathy and Don Gibson are escorting a tour for Warther Travel to the Creation Museum and the Ark on August 12-13th. The tour will leave New Phila and travel by bus to the Creation Museum. After lunch on your own at Noah's Cafe, we'll spend the afternoon exploring the museum, an amazing



75,000 square foot facility that proves that every word of Genesis is true and can be verified with science. You will see life-size displays of Adam and Eve in the garden, Noah building the Ark, and many other Biblical characters. What you learn through the programs and information presented is truly amazing. There are also beautiful botanical gardens, a planetarium, a petting zoo and a great book store/gift shop.

After checking into the Holiday Inn Riverfront, we'll board a private river paddle boat for a great evening of wonderful food and a gospel concert. It promises to be an evening of fun, food and fellowship.

Day two begins with a delicious breakfast at the hotel, then off to The Ark--a life-size replica of Noah's Ark that opens July 7th, meaning we'll be there during the first 40 days and 40 nights! This \$29 million project will be one of the finest and most popular travel destinations in the Midwest. It is 510 feet long, 50 feet tall, and is the largest wooden timber structure in the world. Both the Creation Museum and The Ark are created by Answers in Genesis, a Christian organization whose goal is to prove the Bible is true. It will be a wonderful, inspirational experience with hundreds of displays, including meeting Noah who will answer questions! We'll spend the morning at the Ark, then return to New Phila.

Pastor Mick's story part 7

If you remember, I was telling about my call to full-time ministry. At a revival meeting the visiting evangelist,



with the word of wisdom (1 Cor. 12:8 KJV), told me that God wanted me to be a preacher. I questioned the call.

Have you noticed that God will answer you and confirm it for you as long as you desire to obey Him after He makes it clear? He knows our hearts. I had told Him that I would do whatever He wanted if He would drive all doubts about His will for me out of my mind, especially something like this that would affect my family so significantly. He began to drive the doubts out.

My boss with The Equitable Insurance Company, Pete Russin, was a Catholic by faith from Steubenville who never talked religion. One day, while at the district office doing paper work, Pete came over to me and told me that I would make a good pastor. I suppose I had been talking about God when I came into the office, but where did he get this idea? God was using Pete to speak to me.

Another time I was strolling down the sidewalk along Main Street in Scio, crossing an alley, and ran into Charles Johnson. Charles was a leader in the Scio UM Church and had a reputation as a strong Christian throughout the community. He had known me since we moved to Scio from New Athens when I was six years old. His son was in my grade at school. He had recently been around me serving Christ with other men in the area through parachurch ministries. Charles stopped me as we shared greetings. I remember the exact spot, right in the middle of the alley. He looked me dead in the eye and proceeded to tell me that I was to get out of the insurance business and become a pastor. He was trying to convince me but I didn't say anything, I just listened. God was using Charles Johnson to speak to me.

Then there was the time I was at Beryl Crownable's Garage taking care of some insurance business. He was also a mechanic who



worked on our cars. I was sitting on one of the old folding chairs men would use when they came in to shoot the breeze. I must have brought God into the conversation somehow because Beryl said, "You can't be an insurance man and a preacher; you need to be one or the other". He didn't really like it when I talked about God. Beryl didn't know it, but God was using him to speak to me.

There were similar encounters with other people. God was driving out the doubts.

I had been in the insurance business twelve and a half years working for one company. My plan was to become an independent agent representing various companies so I could be competitive in more areas. I had many contacts in the region by this time and decided it was time to open the Scio Insurance Agency.

I think it was November in 1984 when I called up my old college buddy, Bill Fritts, who lived outside Buffalo, NY. I had introduced him to his wife. He had an independent agency he inherited from his dad and grandad. I wanted to check with him to make sure I covered all legalities necessary for my transition.

We were talking on the phone and Bill was excited as he told me how his agency was growing. He was also teaching business courses at the local junior college and loved it. Somewhere in the conversation the topic switched to God. Bill wasn't a believer so I must have done it. I noticed that the excitement had gone from his end of the phone line to mine. I wasn't that excited when the topic was insurance but I sure was when it was God. Right then and there I made the decision. I told Bill that I wasn't going to open my own agency that I was going to be a fulltime pastor for the Lord. He thought I was nuts and tried to talk me out of it.

I had finally said yes to God.


CPR & AED CLASS

Since the beginning of planning for the Haiti mission trip, I have been hoping for 10 persons to go. Ten seemed like a good number and besides, the group airfare rates are cheaper when you have 10. However, there is less than five months before the trip and today we as a team decided to just keep the number at seven. Six of us are from Broadway and we have one other person from outside of our church.

This means we are no longer eligible for a lower group airfare rate, but since we have fewer persons going, we are much closer to what we need based on an initial new fare we have been quoted. I will be contacting the travel agency to see what new airfare we can actually lock in.

I am sharing this with you because you have been so faithful in supporting us and I wanted to provide an update. This was a very practical decision based on who has had an interest to go and how much time is left for anyone outside the church to raise the funds.

As I ponder what this means for the team, I know His hand is upon this decision. He's sovereign as always. His ways don't always make sense to us nor does He necessarily drop Scripture upon us when we need to make a decision. As I some times say, it would be nice if God was into skywriting His will, but some times He just directs in very practical ways. This, I think, is one of them.

I'm sure there will be many more times before and during the trip when we are going to have to totally rely on Him to direct us when we aren't 100% sure what direction we should take and all we have is the practical and the circumstantial. But God is faithful. He is forming the team. He is directing each circumstance. He is the one who places the desire and will in a heart. No one else does.

So I am resting in this decision and believing that God is directing, because He cares about this trip more than I do and who is on this team more than I ever could.

Please pray for us and the many decisions still to be made as we prepare to go and as we are there. Thanks.
