Dover/New Phila. Food Pantry
Our mission for August is the Dover/New
Philadelphia Food pantry. It is located in the Church of
the Harvest, 420 W. Third Street Dover. The church
allows the food pantry to operate in a warehouse-type
space in the rear of the building. If you have ever driven



by or worked at the pantry you know that hunger exists in our own community. **Hunger:** One small word that effects many people in Northeast Ohio, from the youngest to the elderly.

Parents who lost their jobs or are working in jobs with low wages struggle to put food on the table for their children. Seniors on fixed income make decisions about whether to buy food or pay for necessary prescription medications. People in need face these types of decisions every day, and the Food Pantry is here to help.

Food insecurity refers to the USDA's measure of lack of regular access to nutritional food for an active and healthy life. The food insecurity rate in Tuscarawas County is 13.7% of the total population, & the child food insecurity rate is 23.6%.

In 2015, the Food bank distributed enough food to provide 3,932,901 meals to Tuscarawas County families in need. Of that 1,697,888 pounds was produce.

#### Spread the Word without Saying a Word!

Back in 2008, an atheist in Frankenmuth, MI, complained about 2 crosses on a bridge in town. The town removed them. But when the same person requested that the city remove a cross from the city shield that dated back to their Lutheran beginnings, residents in Frankenmuth



responded by putting crosses in their front yards. Rev. Mark Brandt, lead pastor of a local church, said that the cross should be a symbol of love and unity. That it should also remind us of our responsibility to live as Christians. That was the beginning of the White Cross Movement. In 2012, Lowell Trimmer of Lancaster, OH, brought 2 of the crosses home to display in his yard. He and friends made and distributed 34,000 small white crosses to be displayed throughout the USA. At age 84, he decided it was time for others to take up the work.

The Willing Workers from the Magnolia United Methodist Church decided to take on the cross project They make small white crosses to share with other believers to place in their front yards to honor America's Judeo-Christian heritage and as a simple yet magnificent symbol of our faith in our risen Savior. It is their prayer that each cross will be able to spread the Word without saying a word! In a time when Christians are openly persecuted in different regions of the world, they want to use their freedom of religion to make a visible statement of God's love for all.

The Pairs and Spares Sunday School Class is coordinating this project for Broadway. If you would like to display one of these small white crosses in your front yard, (they are about 12" tall) fill out the form that is in the Pairs and Spares mailbox by the office. The cost of these crosses is a donation. Please make your check out to Broadway UMC and put "P & S Cross" on the memo line. We will order these in bulk from the Magnolia UMC and have them here at Broadway for pickup. Orders need to be placed by August 14th. Join the members of the Pairs and Spares Class making the small, quiet, but powerful statement that Jesus is your Savior and "In God we Trust".

#### **The Future**

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah 6:8

I am home with the rest of the Haiti missions team – safe and sound. God was good and His protection was very real. Thank you for petitioning Him



on our behalf. He sent us to a beautiful place, to people who had very little materially, but who surprised us with their hospitality, generosity and joy.

We were obedient to a call that God gave us – to go, most of us not knowing why, just knowing that we had to go - that we needed to be there. As I have had time to reflect on the trip, I have wondered why He called me. Was it to help build simple houses? Was it to visit some villagers off a narrow, beaten path on the side of the mountain? Was it to bring joy to a child's face with glitter?

For me, all these things were only pieces of a much bigger picture. They were all things that exposed me to a different culture and language, that gave me a first-time experience of a people and a place that was totally unfamiliar. Haiti will no longer be unfamiliar to me now and the trip seemed like a first step – like what Joshua and his spies must have felt as they entered Canaan for the first time.

This trip felt like a beginning, not just a one-time experience. There are many places to do good, but this does not seem like just another place to do good for me. He has told me this is my future.

I don't know when or how or how long, but I know I am to return. I have been praying about this the last few weeks – wondering about next steps, seeking His guidance, trying not to assume anything. He was impressing me even before I left that He has a long view. He is the God that "one day is as a thousand years" (2Peter 3:8), so what is His timing in this case? I don't know.

But while I don't know now, I am very confident in this, that He is faithful. "Thy faithfulness continues throughout all generations." (Psalm 119:90) That He will show me – not necessarily the end, but the next step. When there have been critical points in my life where I had to make decisions, He has spoken to me through His Word. This is what I hope He will do once again. "Thy word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105. A lamp's light shines only so far, but we must step in that direction when God's Word speaks.

An adventure lies ahead.



#### "The Shepherds Lamb"

John 21:15 "Jesus asked Simon (Peter), "Son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you." "Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him.



The spring issue of "Presence" from Open Doors—a Christian organization that ministers to suffering Christians across the world—features the questions,

"Have we grown numb?" on the cover.

More Christians across the world in this time are suffering persecution-horrific experiences largely removed by our government and our media.

Dr. David Curry noted: "We were all moved by the terrorist attacks in Paris and Belgium, (and even, I add, in Orlando, Florida). There was limited media coverage, however, at the attack in Nigeria this January in which

children were specifically targeted and burned alive!

Dr. David Platt writes: "Imagine living in a place where it's illegal to proclaim the gospel or study the Bible. A place where being a follower of Christ could cost you your life." He goes on to say "For millions of followers of Christ, this is an everyday reality—the cost of discipleship is more than most of us can fathom."

As followers of Christ, we of all people, must be aware of, pray for, and give to Christian entities that reach out to these fellow Christians.

I will try to share and highlight a few of these needs in coming newsletters. We need to "feed the lambs", and support them in prayer and action.
