


## **Broadway Care Package for our Troops**



## Your Witness - by Tim Larkin and Don Gibson

This month let's look at a decision for Christ here at Broadway's vacation Bible school (VBS). Ryan, Angela, Xavier, and Brianna Best have been hosting their exchange student from China who's name is Runze Ocean Li. On June 10th, Ocean returned to China a different young man. He went home as a child of God—saved by believing the Word of God. Thank God, the Bests' family life, Broadway's youth group led by Ryan, and Broadway's VBS collectively worked together for Ocean to understand and respond to the reality of the Lord's love and salvation.

Angela said their family wanted to introduce Ocean to Christ. Certainly they wanted him to see his need for Jesus. They included him in their family activities including vacations, Sunday School, youth group, and VBS. Plus, Ocean attended Central Catholic where he received Scriptures blended into school curriculum. Angela explained that Ocean had no background in Christianity or any kind of religion. None! So knowledge or faith in Christ was brand new. But that was about to change because God had a plan for the Best family to be witnesses for Christ, and for Ocean to be saved, as pointed out by Tim Larkin, who actually led Ocean in his salvation prayer.

In God's wisdom, not long before VBS started, Ryan taught youth group a salvation lesson which stressed that accepting Jesus as our personal Savior is the most important decision one could make in life. During VBS, Brianna went to her mom Angela, saying she asked Ocean what he thought about Ryan's salvation lesson, and that Ocean replied he was ready to have Christ in his life. Angela was thrilled! So Angela asked Ocean herself. Again, Ocean said he was ready to receive Christ. Angela said she was so overjoyed and emotional that she ran upstairs to ask Tim Larkin (a VBS leader) if he would pray with Ocean.

Tim explained, "If anyone has the perception that Vacation Bible School is all about kids having fun, or even the work that the Lord does in them, I can testify there is much more to it than that. I have been involved with VBS in one form or another for roughly twenty-five years and have always said that the blessings I received by seeing the excitement in the children's faces as they learn about our God are so much greater than what I have given.

Every year the next to last session on Wednesday is salvation night. Seeds are planted and often we see a child come to the saving grace of our Lord Jesus. Things were winding down Wednesday after a very meaningful evening. Many of the children, and leaders had been touched by the night's message that we all sin but that God loves us so much that He sent His only Son Jesus to suffer the punishment that we deserve. We are separated from the Father by our sin nature and can only be reconciled by Christ's atoning work on the cross.

After the lessons, Angela came to my classroom as we were cleaning up to prepare for the next day, saying Ocean was ready to give his life to Christ and asked if I would be willing to pray with him. Of course I was greatly honored and felt humbled to be asked. As we walked downstairs Angela told me that Ocean felt that he was truly ready to publicly profess his desire to accept God's gift of grace and his desire to live for Him. With Angela right there for support, I prayed with Ocean about his need for a Savior and thanked God for His endless love. Ocean responded. At that moment, Ocean became a child of God. No one can ever take that from him.

At his send-off reception on the day before he returned to China, I asked Ocean what had brought him to make his commitment that evening. He answered it was the feeling he experienced during salvation night, the fact that God loved him and would always be with him. We explained to Ocean it won't always be easy back in China, but he should always remember that God is there with him whether He is welcomed or not." Thank God Ocean is equipped with God's powerful Word because Ryan gave Ocean a Gideon pocket New Testament to continue reading the Word.

Tim continued, "It's obvious Ryan, Angela, Xavier, and Brianna all played a great part in Ocean's salvation. He was nurtured in this Godly household, introduced to a Father he had no knowledge of and, by the faith and love exhibited by his host family, came to love Him also.

Though my part seems to me to be very small, I was blessed to have been used by the Lord to help in bringing Ocean into the Kingdom. There is no telling what the future holds for this young man, what plans the Lord has for him. God leads one to tell another, who tells another, who tells another. Ocean's possibilities are great. He will go to places we will never see. Let's all keep Ocean in our prayers every day, for strength and for courage, that he will stand fast and find encouragement. As for us? Always be ready." (1st Peter 3:15)

Ocean said he'd been praying at VBS, that he realized God loved him, was always with him, and would be there for him even when he messed up in life. Angela said she was so happy that it made her cry. No wonder!

## **Broadway's "GIVE ONLINE"**

## How easy is it? REALLY EASY!



## Just 5 minutes...depending on how fast you can type!

When we first started online giving I set up mine thru Broadway's website. I could choose from weekly, monthly or a one-time donation. I chose monthly because our family is on a fixed income. I entered my name, address, what I was giving each month, when I wanted the donation taken from my account, and my banking information. I could have chosen to use my credit card. (But, I didn't want to pay extra fees or have Broadway have to pay either!)

I was able to divide my donation for General Funds, the Mission of the Month, the Capital Improvement Fund, the Endowment Fund and Good Samaritan Fund. Sometimes there are special Mission Project lines Red Bird Mission. Each month the mission changes and so do the special envelope projects. There are open lines for any special that I wanted to give funds. I just specify where the funds were to go on the line beside the amount I designated!

At the end I saved all my information and I received a confirmation that I had signed up and a receipt with my donation information! Now, I don't have to write a check (unless I want to!) or go online to make another donation, it does automatically! I can even make changes to any information or funds any time I want!

"Give Online" Authorization Forms are in the Narthex if you would like the church to enter your information for you. Or, add our QR to your phone!!

How easy was it? If I could do it, so can you!

## **MISSION FOR July**

The monthly mission of the month is the Good Samaritan Fund. One of the responsibilities of the church secretary is to administer Broadway's Good Samaritan Fund. All Good Samaritan information is strictly confidential.

The Good Samaritan Fund provides assistance for short-term, emergency situations. We help with



assistance to those living in Tuscarawas County and our congregation in outlying areas. We help with rent and utilities. We consider how many are in the family and other available assets in making determination regarding assistance levels. We give assistance only once a year.

Anyone asking for food is referred to the Dover/New Phila. Food pantry and/or Friends of the Homeless.

Here are a few ways we check up on those asking for assistance

- Check for outstanding warrants or possible court actions.
- Contact the Salvation Army for more information to validate the applicant's situation.
- Check with their employer for verification.
- •Determine to call their landlord to confirm they are good tenants who usually pay their rent.

Good Sam is always here for any of our Broadway family who need assistance and it is always given in a confidential manner. Thank you, Broadway Church, for entrusting me as I prayerfully minister to those in need in the name of Jesus. ## "The Shepherd's Lambs" by Donna Deedrick

"Jesus asked Simon (Peter), "Son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you." "Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him" (John 21:15).

This month I received an "Open Doors" mailing regarding a frantic middle of the night call to the regional representatives with devastating news. "Pastor Paul" broken heartedly i

representatives with devastating news. "Pastor Paul" broken heartedly informed them of attacks on Christians in his area of North Eastern Nigeria. Countless Christian believers were slaughtered, churches and homes destroyed. Hundred of children were later found wandering in the forest alone, crying for help, their parents gone.

This is a common occurrence in parts of the world today.

Note the enclosed letter from Brother Andrew, the founder of "Open Doors" (well known as "God's Smuggler" for past decades).

### Dear Friend,

This is a pivotal moment in history. Our persecuted brothers and sisters are experiencing unprecedented levels of persecution, unparalleled at any other time in the modern era.

I believe it's a wake-up call from God. He is shaking His people out of their deep slumber, desiring for us to come together as the worldwide Body of Christ and stand with our suffering brothers and sisters.

God is Almighty, yet He often chooses to work His perfect will through the least likely vessels—His people.

It starts with prayer. Prayer cuts through all obstacles. It goes where we cannot. There are no doors that can shut it out.

Through prayer and decisive action taken in faith, the Lord will use our offerings to bless His people. We can see individual lives and entire Christian communities restored and equipped to share the gospel.

They might seem so small, but your prayers and financial support make an eternal impact. Hope and trust in Christ is restored in the face of severe persecution, and the Good News and love of Jesus Christ go forth as a result. I praise God for your support.

Please pray for the suffering, and support reputable Christian organizations who minister to them.
