Wednesday, November 1, 6:00 pm-7:15 pm

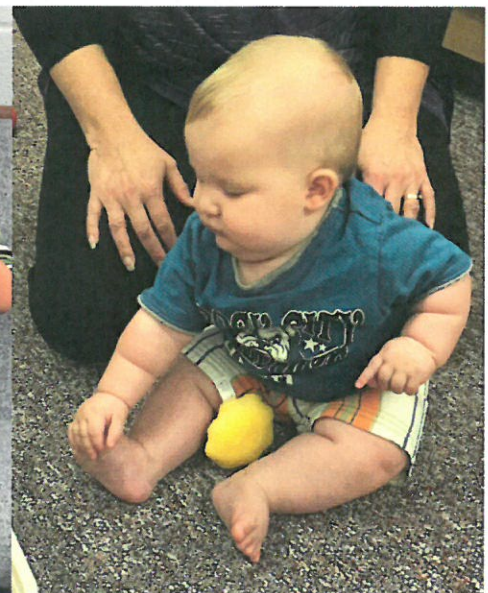

"This Is A TEST"
PARSON'S PICKET



Some time ago I was going through the mail, setting aside material meant for our daughter Tara. We were still receiving some of her mail because she had been staying with us. She had received a newsletter from one of the ministries she was financially supporting. I wasn't familiar with that ministry so I was skipping through it to find what they believed, looking out for Tara's spiritual interests. There were many articles and they seemed to promote sound scriptural principles.

The title of one of the articles caught my attention: This Is Just a Test; Do Not Get Excited. Before even reading the article, my mind shifted into teaching mode. One of the major reasons for the troubles in our lives is to test our faith. So, if the trouble is just a test, we shouldn't get excited.

Back in school, I knew people who did not take tests well. Even though they knew the answers, they got fearful and did poorly. It works the same with God's children; we don't always handle troubles well. We may know what the Bible says but may still get all worked up when confronted with the realities of the problem.

Think about it a moment. The tests we take for our spiritual schooling are in a controlled environment. The Teacher picks each question with our very best interests in mind and He most assuredly knows the correct answers. He himself chooses the time and place. "And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to His purpose for them" (Romans 8:28 NLT). God is our Teacher and He tests us with many of the troubles we have in life. He controls our circumstances better than any other teacher because He is the Almighty, the Sovereign God, and Lord over everything. He would never give us a test for which we weren't ready!

God told the Israelites, "And you shall remember all the way which the LORD your God has led you in the wilderness these forty years, that He might humble you, testing you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not" (Deuteronomy 8:2). He was testing them to reveal what was in their hearts. He already knew. God wanted them to see what they needed to give attention to in their lives, for their spiritual schooling—as He does us.

Let's try not to get too excited when the troubles of life come to test our faith. Let us try to learn what He is teaching us so we don't have to take the same tests over and over again.

Your Witness / Christ's Calling - by Don Gibson

God's goal when we witness Christ to lost souls is that they confess their sinful nature and believe Jesus Christ to save them. They must believe it takes God to save them—not themselves and not us. (See Romans 3:10-11, 3:23; 6:23; 10:10-13). Further, 1 Corinthians 3:4-11 reminds us that our role is all or part of a process (1) to **plant** the seed (God's Word); (2) **water** with God's Word and love; and (3) **let God do His Spiritual work** (Titus 3:3-7). Praying counts, too. While salvation is an act of God, He calls us to reveal Christ (the Word) through our words and actions.

So how do we know if we are planting or watering? Ask people where they are with the Lord—then proceed as the Holy Spirit leads. Two examples follow:

Example #1: Kathy witnessed to a young woman during her Tusc County jail visit through the Gideon Auxiliary jail ministry. It was an informal "church service" for about 10 women—most there for drug violations. Many had children. One's husband was also in jail. During the service Kathy and another Gideon Auxiliary woman led the women in singing and reading Scriptures blended with discussion. Kathy showed how the Bible applies personally to every person—that God loves everyone, that Christ paid our penalty for our sins by dying on the cross, and that it takes God Himself to save us from our sinful nature. In their discussion, all but one woman said they believed Christ as Savior. One woman said she didn't know where she was going if she would die in two minutes. She had paid attention so far by singing and reading Scriptures. Kathy watched her wipe away tears several times. The Holy Spirit told Kathy to ask, "Are you ready now to pray to confess Christ as your personal Savior? She said yes. Kathy led her through a sinner's prayer.

What happened? Through reading and singing, God convicted this woman through His Word to believe and confess Christ (Romans 10:10). Did Kathy plant or water? God knows. The point? She was ready.

Example #2: I was working the Gideon Bible distribution booth at the Stark County Fair just weeks ago. A woman about 50 years old approached wanting a New Testament Bible. I gently handed her one and asked, "Are you a believer in God's Word?" She said yes. I continued, "Are you a believer in Jesus Christ that you know where you will go when you die?" Again she said yes. "How do you know?" I asked. She answered, "Because I was baptized as a little girl and I try to live a good life." I knew right away—works! She didn't believe even the very basic Scriptures about why Jesus was born, died and resurrected. But I didn't say, "Hey lady, you're wrong." What did she need? God's Word, the only answer. So I asked, "May I show you a few Scriptures in that New Testament to help clarify God's truth about how we get to Heaven?" "Sure!" she responded. So I showed her Romans 3:23; 6:23 and 10:4-11. Then I asked her if we had just read that God allowed people into Heaven because they were water-baptized or tried to be good. She looked up from the Scriptures to me and replied. "No." Then I asked, "So what did we just read?" She said, "It's God, not us, who saves us. And we need to ask Him." I said, "Amen." and asked, "Isn't it good that the Bible tells us the truth?" She agreed. She said she needed to go read more Scripture. Did I see interest? Yes. Did I see conviction for her to pray for salvation that moment? No. But she let me pray with her. She thanked me and left with her New Testament Bible.

What happened? I planted the seed (God's Word). God will do the rest.

It Will Be Worth It

“Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials; knowing that the testing of your faith procures endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.” James 1:2-4



I am leading a Bible study on Jeremiah in the Growing in Christ Sunday School class.

In my preparation, I learned that Jeremiah prophesied for 40 years to the southern kingdom of Judah. He warned them day after day, week after week, month after month and year after year that they needed to turn away from their idolatry and sin, that God would punish them, if they didn't. I have been really struck with how long 40 years is - saying the same message. In the end, Babylon takes Judah into captivity just as Jeremiah prophesied as part of their punishment.

Jeremiah like many prophets suffered. He feared for his life; there were plots against him; he escaped a death sentence; he was thrown into a cistern. However, he continued to preach, to warn, to say things people didn't want to hear. God told him, "And they will fight against you, but they will not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you," declares the Lord." Jer. 1:19.

God was with him and he held on to that truth and was obedient, despite the opposition.

As I think and pray over the obstacles there are in going to Haiti, I am comforted by the fact that when we are called, when we are obedient to His voice, He is faithful. He does not fail. He will help us – not in our strength and not necessarily one time so we never have to worry (think 40 years!). And as we have faith, we will receive endurance. We will be more like Him in the end and it will be worth it.

Many thanks to all those who have supported our pizza and chicken dinner fundraisers! Our goal is to raise about \$12,300 to pay for transportation, food, water, staff/translators and ministry projects. In order to make this fall festival a success the Children's Ministry is looking for Volunteers and Donations. Please pray for our Event and let God help you to see which direction he wants to use you.

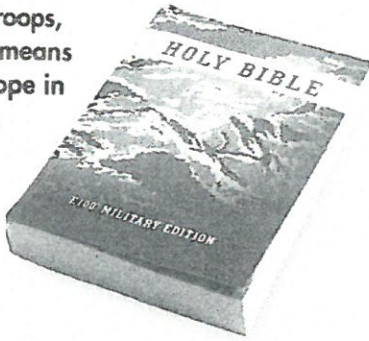
Volunteers needed: Set up Leader's team, Outreach Leader's team, Station Guides, a photographer, and any Middle/High School students to be mini maker helpers.

WHO ME? *So you want to be a Sunday school teacher?*

What, you have doubts about teaching kids' Sunday school? You do not know if you are cool enough or young enough for the kids to relate to you. You are not sure if you are old enough or wise enough to be able to teach kids effectively. You may not have what it takes to keep the children entertained. Your church may not have the budget to create an eye popping multimedia presentation for children's church each week!

It is okay, you do not have to have all those "things" to be an effective Sunday school teacher. Kids do not need another cool friend. Children need someone who cares, knows their names, encourages them, makes them feel important—someone they can count on who is stable. Above all, kids need someone who has a desire to teach them about God.

Meaningful lessons are not the same thing as entertaining lessons. You do not have to be a stand-up comic to be an effective teacher. A well-illustrated object lesson or science experiment will remain with kids much longer than a lot of hoopla. Multimedia presentations are fine, but they will soon be forgotten. Draw the kids into the lesson and the group, by helping them become part of the lesson. Include the children as often as possible. Allow them to act out the Bible stories, read the Bible passages, draw on the whiteboards, ask questions, and participate in class discussions. Be encouraging.

You see it does not matter if you are twenty-two or sixty-seven, kids are not hung up by age. If you have a desire to teach children about God you are well on your way to becoming an effective Sunday school teacher. With prayer, a little practice and some planning you can create a Sunday school environment that will make a difference in a lot of children's lives.

As our Children's Ministry is continuing to grow, we are in need of Volunteers. If God is calling you to help in our Children's Ministry please see Micki Coon. We have been able to fill empty spots in the Toddler Room at this time. But we are still in need of Volunteers to serve as teachers and assistants. 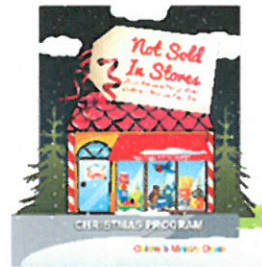

Jesus asked Simon (Peter), “Son of John, do you love me more than these?” “Yes, Lord,” Peter replied, “you know I love you.” “Then feed my lambs,” Jesus told him” (John 21:15).



“Imagine living in a place where it’s illegal to proclaim the gospel or study the Bible. A place where being a follower of Christ could cost you your life. For millions of followers of Christ, this is an every day reality.”

“The persecuted church is a secret church, underground, hidden from the eyes of earthly authorities. But they are not hidden from God.” (Quotes from Open Doors)

It is unpleasant, even distressing to learn about those who suffer horrific situations across our world simply for following Jesus. News Media very rarely reports on this, and even our churches rarely bring it up, for it is ‘painful’ to consider, and we feel saddened and helpless to make a difference. I am as guilty as anyone, averting my eyes, seeking ‘more pleasant’ things to think about. This is not “Christ-like” we are all part of God’s family. He died for all of us, and we will be living in Heaven with Him someday.

Leafing through some “Open Doors” resources I read of Christina, a wife and mother in a Northern Nigeria area very hostile to the Christians dwelling there. Having heard of murdered neighbors, and being warned of the approach of a murderous force, they began to flee their home for safety. Christina’s husband turned back to get a motorcycle, as she, her children and others continued running. She never saw her husband again, for he was killed, and his body was burned alone with their home and all of their possessions. Now a widow with seven children to care for, she continues her walk with the Lord. She states: “I get discouraged at times, and want to give up” but clings to her faith in the Lord day by day. She requests prayers for her children and herself (Nigeria is #12 on the Watch List.)

“Vipur” lives in a village in India where people want him dead. He grew up in a Hindu family, but came to believe in, and receive Jesus through a Christian friend who prayed for him during a serious illness. Vipur received God’s truth and was baptized. Now he serves God in the area, leading others to Christ and discipling new believers. Christian believers are despised, and opposed by area Hindus. One night, leaving a home-church gathering on his way home, he was set upon, attacked, and brutally beaten—nearly losing his life. He says “Despite my injuries, I have not thought about leaving my village, or quitting the ministry.” He adds “Wherever I go, persecution awaits me—it’s part of Christian life in India. He is also a husband and father. (India is #15 on Watch List).

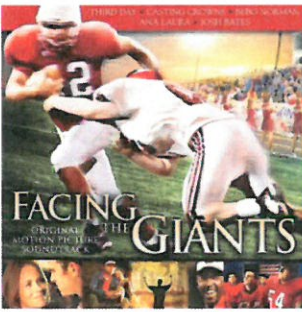
First Boxes of Care Packages Sent Out!
