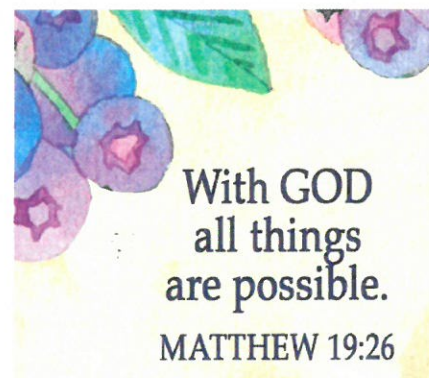

## “FIRST FRIDAY FAST – F3”, pt. 2



I would like to continue the topic we were on in the last newsletter – **fasting**. Again, in Matthew 6:16, Jesus said, “When you fast”, not “if” you fast. He is indicating that it is a normal discipline through which believers profit spiritually. We need all the help we can get.

You can fast on your own, though others in your house may need to know for food preparation, or you can fast with a group. A whole congregation may want to fast in order to hear from God for direction or major decisions in their church. A family may feel led to fast or the believers in a local community. Samuel the prophet called the whole nation of Israel to a one day fast after repeated raids by the Philistines (1 Samuel 7:1-14). The United States Senate asked President Abraham Lincoln to designate a national day of repentance and sorrow for sins against Almighty God with fasting during the Civil War.

Father God said He would reward us for fasting if we were not doing it to impress others. By exercising control over physical areas through fasting God may give you more power to control physical sins and desires for over-eating, unhealthy food, smoking, alcohol, lust, bad sleeping habits, ungodly TV, or wrong music. He may also give greater power for spiritual control over envy, anger, impatience, hatred, doubt, fear, or a sharp tongue. Self-control in fasting may pass into other areas of life.

It is crucial for you to realize that you cannot fast in order to get God to do “your will”! It is not done to make God hear us, but so we might better hear Him! The greatest reward for fasting is finding “His will”, and getting the grace necessary to follow it. That is why prayer and fasting go together. We don’t fast to “earn” a reward by offering God some great sacrifice for temporarily giving up something. God always desires to give us grace to find and follow His will. Fasting shows our desire to receive that grace.

Fasting is an exercise in humility, according to Isaiah 58:1-14. Because we realize we don’t deserve anything from God, grateful believers gladly deny physical and material pleasures in order to get closer to Him. Sometimes our souls mourn over sins and we are moved to cry out to God with prayers and fasting. Old Testament soul mourning was expressed by tearing one’s clothes, wearing sackcloth, and throwing ashes over the head.

As New Testament believers we conceal our fasting because we know it is a soul thing, between God and me, so we go directly to Him with requests. Jesus tells us in Matthew 6:17 to comb our hair and wash our faces so no one will suspect we are fasting except our Father. He desires that kind of relationship.

We should not neglect it privately nor in groups because **fasting is a regular discipline for calling on God’s grace to find and follow His will**. Can we join together on the first Friday every month and fast for the mission and ministry of our church? Drink only water after supper on Thursday until you eat supper on Friday the following day—or adjust the length, food, or drink as you are led by God. Our Father said He would reward us!

## MISSION FOR May: Friends of Israel

### April 12 was a Day of Remembrance for Israel.

It is to remember those who were killed in the Holocaust. Malachi 3:16 *“God has a book of remembrance with the names of those who feared*



*him and honor His name.”* In the Holocaust 1/3 of the German Jews were murdered. In Europe 2/3 of the European Jews were killed.

In 1938, as Jewish cries for help rang out in Europe, a group of pastors and businessmen in Philadelphia came together to provide relief to the Jewish people. Taking to heart *Genesis 12:3 to bless Israel*, The Friends of Israel was born—10 years before Israel was even a country! Even as the atrocities of the Holocaust were unfolding. God was at work.

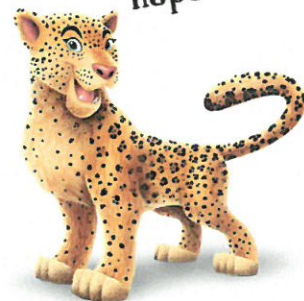

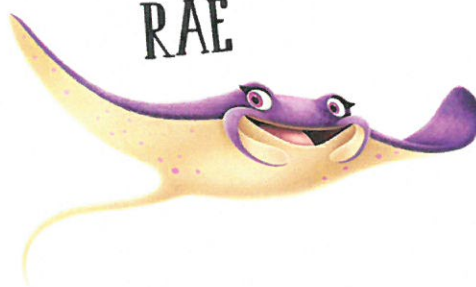

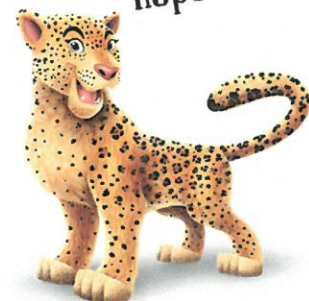

## **Your Witness--Sin is Common; So is God's Help --** by Don Gibson

Did you ever have people refer to sin in their life—but they don't see it as sin? It's their life style—so natural that it doesn't cross their mind they're sinning. What does God want us to do? Ignore it? Never! Witness for Christ? Let's explore.

The Bible reminds us that temptation to sin is common to everyone. **1 Corinthians 10:13a** *"There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man:"* Sometimes it becomes a habit of sin. But instead of condemning this person in our mind, let's understand as instruments of God's love and righteousness that He calls us to seek and discern His will when He places us in such a time as this. The more we pray and study Scriptures to prepare ourselves, the more we fulfill His calling to be His workers in revealing Jesus in a sin-based world. **2 Timothy 2:15** *"Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."*

So the situation presents itself. What's God promise? **Psalms 119:105** *"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."* We know God's Word always lights our way—even when this happens. What else does it say—in the verse right before that? **Psalms 119:104** *Through thy precepts I get understanding: therefore I hate every false way."* Is that true? Do we hate the false way of our friend? Are we as believers in accord with God's truth that we understand what others see as OK is not OK? Is God calling us to draw our billy club police stick?

First, is this person a believer or not? God knows. God tells us in **Romans 3:10-11** that apart from Christ, no one is righteous and no one understands God's ways. So if this person doesn't trust Christ as Savior AND Lord, our explanations of why their practice is sinful will likely be met with resistance. However, God may lead us to *"Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven."* - **Matthew 5:16**. Remember, Christ does the calling, not us (John 12:32). It's time for prayer. "God, let your light shine through me so you are glorified." I stated earlier God doesn't want us to ignore it when people speak of their sin. Maybe we are to pray for that person as we walk away. "God show me Scriptures to equip me so the next time I'm with that person you will open the door for me to witness for Christ." **Psalms 61:1** *"Hear my cry, O God; attend unto my prayer."*

## June Mission of the Month: Red Bird Mission

The Red bird area of Kentucky is deep in the Appalachian Mountains. The rugged mountains make for beautiful scenery, but also difficult transportation, little employment, and extreme poverty. The Eastern Appalachian Mountains in Kentucky have some of the poorest counties in America. Today the need remains critical in this isolated, rural distressed area. Chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing, and rugged mountainous terrain provide obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area.



Red Bird Mission is located near the tiny post office of Beverly, KY. Founded with just a school in 1921, today it has grown to a full-service mission of the United Methodist Church, the only one of its kind in the U.S. It serves approximately 14,000 people each year.

The story of Red Bird is one of deep faith in God. Red Bird Mission was born in answer to prayer. It is a story of gracious outpouring of prayer and means by the church.

Mission staff members hold deep respect for the local culture. Many grew up there, graduated from Red Bird Mission School, and are currently raising families here. People at Red Bird are very family oriented; they own their land; relatives and several generations are likely to reside near each other. People there take care of their own; even though there's a very high homeless rate, you don't see it because multiple generations and multiple families may live in one house. The people are very proud and resilient.

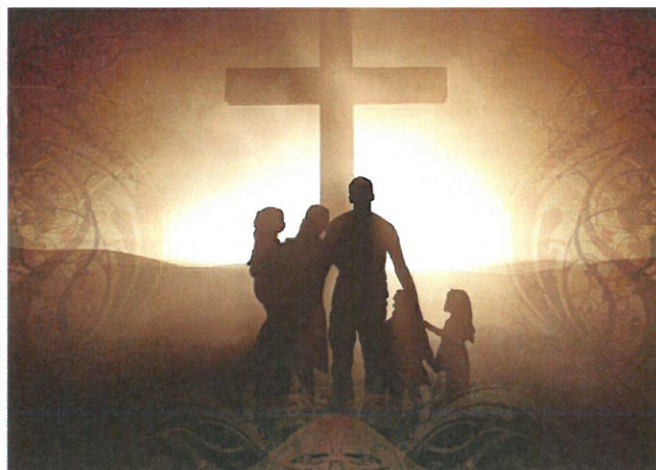

## The Power of Prayer

*“Again I say to you, that if two of you agree on earth about anything that they may ask, it shall be done for them by My Father who is in heaven. For where two or three have gathered together in My name, there I am in their midst.” Matt. 18:19,20.*



As I listened to Pastor Bracken Foster’s message on Sunday, I was reminded of the great power that is unleashed by God when His people are united in prayer for a cause. In this case, it was the miraculous healing of Bracken, Pastor Mick and Becky’s son, from a near fatal illness. It was an amazing testimony of God’s power unleashed when doctors were puzzled and things looked bleak. God in His incredible mercy heard His people and spared this young man. And why was he spared? As Pastor Bracken said so “that Christ shall even now, as always be exalted in my body” (Phil.1:20).

Our Haiti missions team will be in Haiti from June 16-23 to once again support the small Nazarene Church in Manze Marie in their ministry. We will be Broadway UMC’s ambassadors for Christ as we visit homes, share Haitian Bibles, help with construction and teach VBS. This will be our third trip to the remote village in the southern mountains of Haiti.

Unlike some groups who go to a site to work and never return, the purpose of these trips is to establish a relationship with this church, its pastor, Pastor Elbarre, and the people of the community. It may seem outrageous to expect God to use us when we are only there for a week. But that is if you believe in a small God. However, our God is not small. We believe in the God of the universe who decided to use a few simple fishermen to change the world. Wouldn’t it have been so much easier to drop an army of supernatural creatures to earth and have them spread the message to everyone? But no, God came Himself in the form of Jesus Christ and said, I want YOU to be transformed and used by Me to change the world (Rom. 12:2, 2Cor. 5:20). I will die so you might live eternally – and, oh yes, I will send you a powerful Helper, the Holy Spirit, too.

And so, as I think about our small team going once again to a place that is steeped in poverty (but rich in joy), with real dangers (think tarantulas & black widow spiders) and a history of spiritual warfare (e.g., voodoo), I would ask that you pray for us as we prepare to go and as we are there – that God would use us, protect us and empower us for what He wants to accomplish through us. The team consists of Brennan Baker, Diane Bell, Cindy McComb, Arielle Reichman, Brian Rose and myself. Praise be to God that we have this church behind us that we can ask to pray for us. I am very thankful for you.
