Broadway is hosting a Shoebox Packing Party for Operation Christmas Child (OCC)

Time to pack shoe boxes! **Thursday November 1st, @ 5:30.** Come for a light meal and then pack shoeboxes about 6:30pm in Spencer Hall. This will be a fun night of fellowship and packing. Gift-filled shoeboxes are a tangible way to introduce children to God's greatest gift, salvation through Jesus Christ. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.



You can also pack at home, all shoeboxes need to be in by **Sunday, Nov. 4th.** They will then be taken to the collection site. From the collection site they will be taken to the processing center. At the processing center each shoebox is opened and inspected to make sure all items are appropriate to send. From there they will be taken to the shipping docks for departure to over 100 countries. Last year our shoe boxes went to Malawi and Zimbabwe, Africa, Columbia and Peru!

A donation of \$9 is critical to cover shipping and other project costs. Give and you discover the destination of your shoebox. We will use the labels at the shoe box packing party on November 2. Adopt 1 or more shoeboxes for \$9 each, write on your envelope on the line marked **Other** (adopt a shoe box or OCC shipping.) You may adopt your shoe boxes now until the packing party on November 2. Your **Thanksgiving Offering will go toward OCC postage.** Thank you for your continued support to the Operation Christmas Child shoe box mission.

“SATISFIED AFTER THE HOLIDAYS”



Some years ago in mid-November I was listening at home to Bethany playing the piano. She had progressed from simple to more complex music and was trying to play Christmas songs, working hardest on, “What Child Is This?” She is the youngest of our children and usually the first to bring up Christmas, as she did that year. As early in the season as it was, the stores were even earlier.

Most people have figured out why the stores prepare us so soon for Christmas; it’s their most profitable time of the year. They need the sales. They’re trying to milk it for all they can get. That’s OK, it’s just good business. Of course, good business will emphasize Santa Clause and gift giving more than Jesus Christ and God coming in the flesh to save us.

The trouble is, we who have been saved by Jesus Christ know we should keep Him as the reason for the season, but we get caught up in the world’s focus anyway. We start shopping before Thanksgiving, and some I know, whom I dearly love, start much sooner. One year Seth asked if we could put up the outside lights in early November while it was still warm. Not such a bad idea, but I just couldn’t do it. In my mind that would undermine the importance of Thanksgiving, which the world cares little about anyway because there is not much money to be made from it.

The world wants us to get the Christmas season going as soon as possible. The more we prepare, the more we spend. Well, there is the outside decorating and the inside decorating. It’s nice and all, but look at the money and time we sink into it. And those gifts, they have to be just right. That takes time and money. Becky and I have, in the past, taken out the twelve month savings plan at the bank to be able to afford it. Don’t forget all it takes to send out those Christmas cards. I’m trying to deemphasize them. Then, there are the parties to go to, buy food for, and more, sometimes much more.

Add all the church and religious activities to that list and you have quite a buildup to December 25th. There’s no way the arrival of that day can live up to the preparations and expectations that lead up to it. No wonder so many kids fly through their presents and are irritable the rest of Christmas day. For many it’s quite a let-down. Christmas can’t live up to the world’s expectations.

Now, I know we should enjoy all those preparations as a part of Christmas and not expect that one day to satisfy. But the fact is, many people are depressed after the holidays and take weeks to come out of it.

How might we improve that situation? The answer is simple. Scale down the money and time involved in preparation, and focus more on Jesus Christ. Remember, He was born in a stable. When we put our expectations in Him, we will always be satisfied! Jesus will never disappoint us! He can live up to His billing!

Your Witness—Thanksgiving and Christmas—By Don Gibson

As we progress through the Thanksgiving and Christmas season, we will hear any number of people express that they are **thankful or that they “love” Christmas**. These are **door openers** God may lead us to respond to.

If we are in the Word daily and praying that God use us to draw people to Christ (whether believers or not), God will open doors. God will **engineer circumstances giving us opportunities to witness**. We'll pick up on people's words.

Though it's a year-round calling by God, if there's an annual witnessing season, this is it! People refer to being thankful or to Christmas. They talk about visiting, shopping, eating—you name it. Some talk about Christ our Savior's birth. **But here's the point—they bring it up**. It's up to us to **be Spiritually ready to sense God leading us** to ask them a question. Maybe like this.

“Christmas is special to me, too. “What makes Christmas special to you?” Their answers are our entry point. If it's about Christ, we're in a chat with a fellow believer, whether we know them or not. If it's not, the Holy Spirit gives us questions to ask. **The point—get them talking** so we know where to start.

Here's a recent typical opportunity, though not season-related. A repairman for my neighbor asked if he could return for a follow-up visit on Wednesday. Ah, my witnessing entry point. I indicated we would need to wrap-up by 5 because I have church Bible Study soon after. I asked him **if he ever attended a Bible study or worship**. He no. God led me to ask further. “So do you have any kind of a relationship with God? Are you a believer in Christ?” He answered, “Well, I was saved three years ago. I attended church for a while (at a certain church), but I got away from it. I usually have to work on Sundays.” I asked if he read the Bible. No. By then he became tearful saying he should get closer to God. This man was under conviction. The Holy Spirit led him into this dialogue. As a believer, he was starved spiritually. He agreed.

I handed him **Romans 12:2** and I asked him to read it out loud. **He read “...Be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind...”** He looked up and agree he needed that. I gave him the Gideon Bible app for his smart phone and he loaded it right then in my neighbor's garage. He said he would read it everyday. I asked him about church or Bible studies Sunday evenings or week-nights. I'll follow up with him. This man unknowingly opened the door. God led him. God led me. God leads us year-round!

“The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest.” Luke 10:2

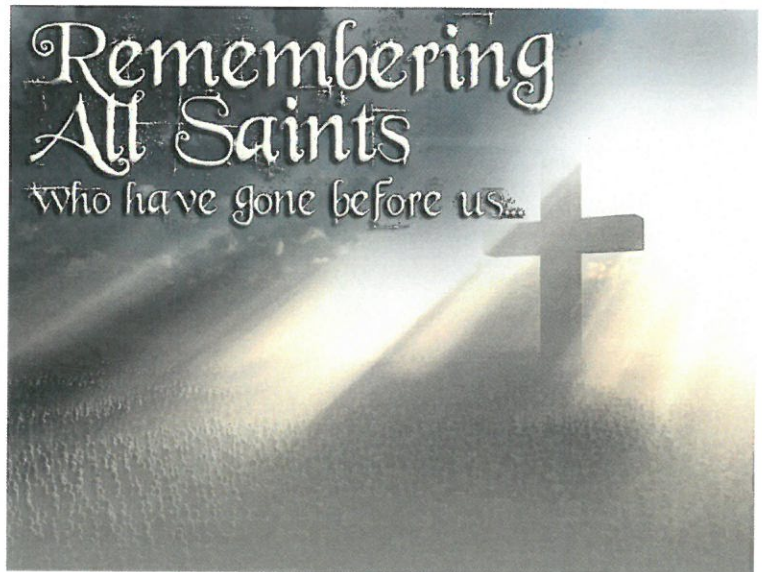

The following guidelines are to determine those to be recognized on this important day on the Christian calendar.

1. Current members of Broadway Church who have attended regularly.
2. Current members of Broadway Church who could not attend regularly due to illness or distance. Consideration shall be given to the length of absence and whether family members will attend the All Saints' Sunday observance.
3. Former members whose spiritual influence is still felt within the Broadway Church family. Consideration shall be given as to whether family members will attend the All Saints' Sunday observance.
4. Those persons who are not members of Broadway but were presently active in the life of our local church at the time of their deaths. Consideration shall be given if illness has kept them from attending.
5. Former pastors of Broadway Church.

Discretion in working within these guidelines shall lie with the Pastor.



Mission of the Month for November: Ann Spencer Food Fund

This is a new Mission Project providing Thanksgiving Dinners and Christmas Dinners to individuals in need, providing milk to Harbor House (6 to 8 gallons a week) and an available resource for church members who have been hospitalized, had surgery, etc. and are in need of some meals. Other food needs will be addressed as they are brought to our attention to utilize this new project. A great way to show our love to our brothers and sisters in Christ. Thanksgiving Mission: JOBS FOR LIFE

This is a local program (in existence for 4 ½ years) founded and directed by Rev. Scott Bell and located in the basement of the Tuscarawas County Administration Building.

Quoted from TR article: “We work with those that are coming out of incarceration, homelessness, addiction and just feeling as if they will never get ahead. This population is usually marginalized in towns like Dover/New Philadelphia because we don’t want to admit that we have a marginalized population like that. But I’m here to tell you we do. And so, the mission statement for our organization is this: Meet people where they are.” There are an estimated 175 to 200 people who have graduated from Jobs for Life.

Compass Center accepts no local, state, or federal grant money. They rely totally on donations. Their Faith perspective program is based on the book of Proverbs as they pray with their clients, pray for their clients and hold Sunday morning services dealing one on one with their issues. To date they have seen 7 baptisms and 2 weddings. Praise God!

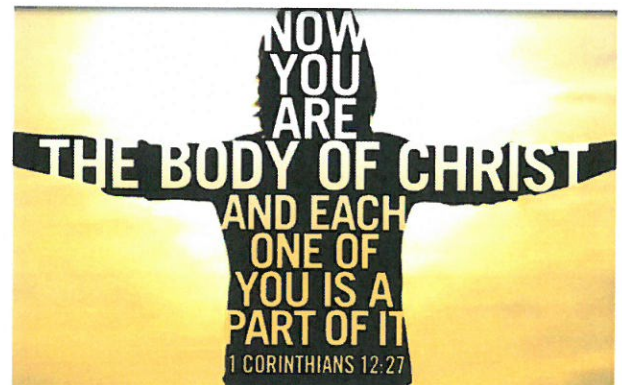

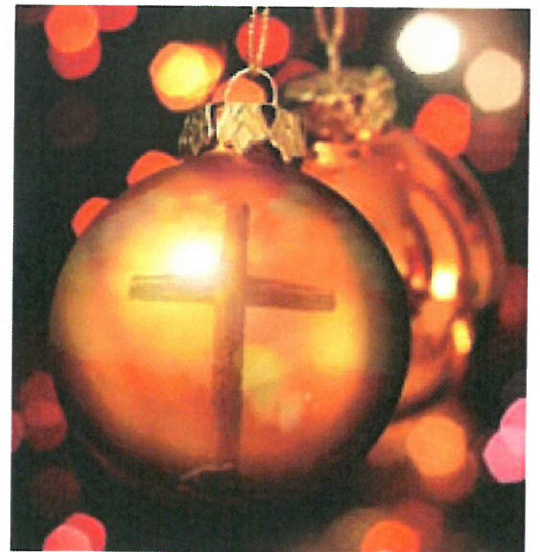

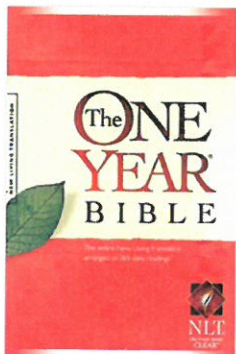
Christmas Eve Candlelight Worship

All funds go toward the Broadway Mission Workers' local missions and nursing home and homebound visitation.

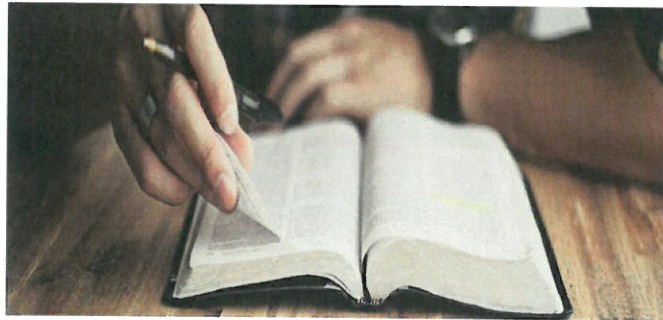
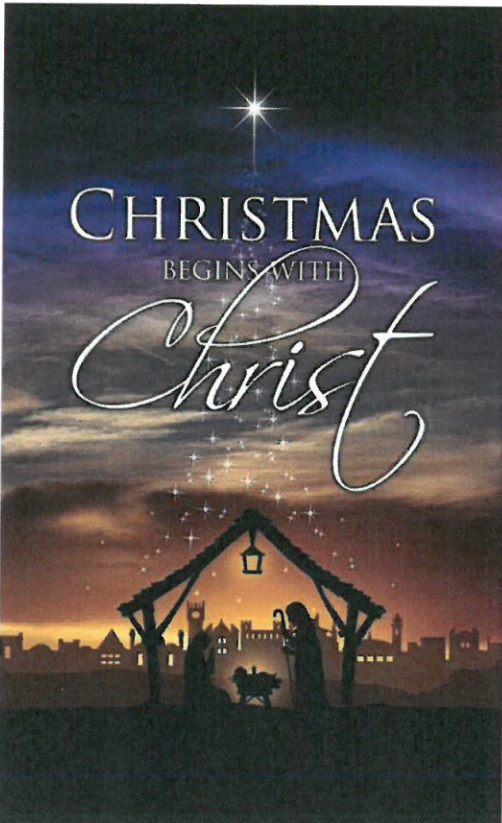
Share-a-Christmas

“Whom have I in heaven, but Thee? And besides Thee, I desire nothing on earth.”

Psalm 73:25



We all have loves in our life. We love our kids. We love our spouse. We love our friends. We love our hobbies. We love our sports. But God calls us to love Him. It seems like a simple command, “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength” (Mk. 12:30). But it is a life-long goal that I don’t think we ever achieve here. Stuff gets in the way.

As I think about the people I love and the things I love and the activities I do, I am more apt to cling to them, than to God. But this calling to go to Haiti is something that is beyond this world and these loves of mine. I don’t really understand it. I don’t really know why I need to go. But there is no doubt in my mind that I do need to go and at some point – longer than a week as these last three trips have been.

These trips to Haiti are a taste of the culture and the people and the mission that awaits me. While my heart loves the things and people of my current life, it is hard to think I will be separated from them. Yet, He wants me to believe as Paul did that “whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ” (Phil. 3:7). It is not an easy truth to believe when our heart loves the things of this earth – so much. But it is a truth that we need to believe, I need to believe.

What God offers is more. It is more even if it doesn’t seem like it could possibly be more, because God fulfills in a way we cannot understand. Doing His will fulfills in a way that all the things and persons that we love can never do. With faith, we can believe this truth because “Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things **not seen**” Heb. 11:1. My future is a great unknown, but God is not. He is good and kind and generous and loving. He will not fail when we step out in faith to whatever He calls us to do. Only God is enough.

So I would like to end this with a few questions. What do you love? Are you willing to count them all as loss for the sake of Christ? What is God calling you to?

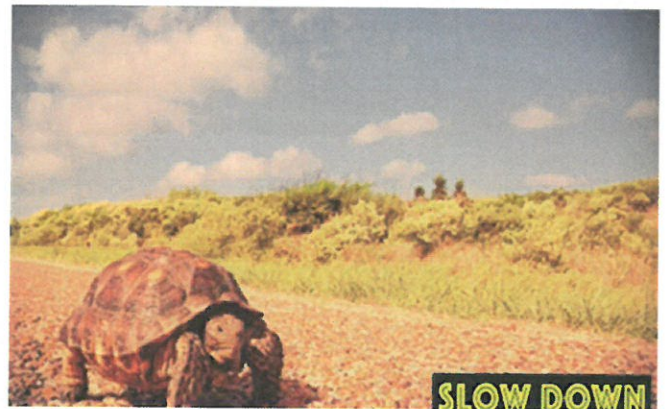
NEWS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

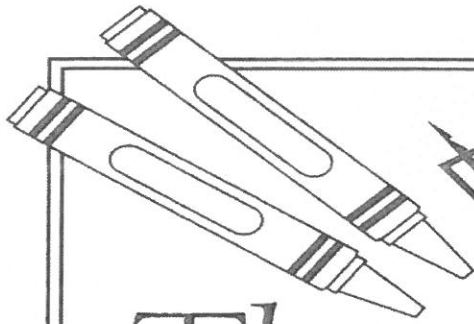

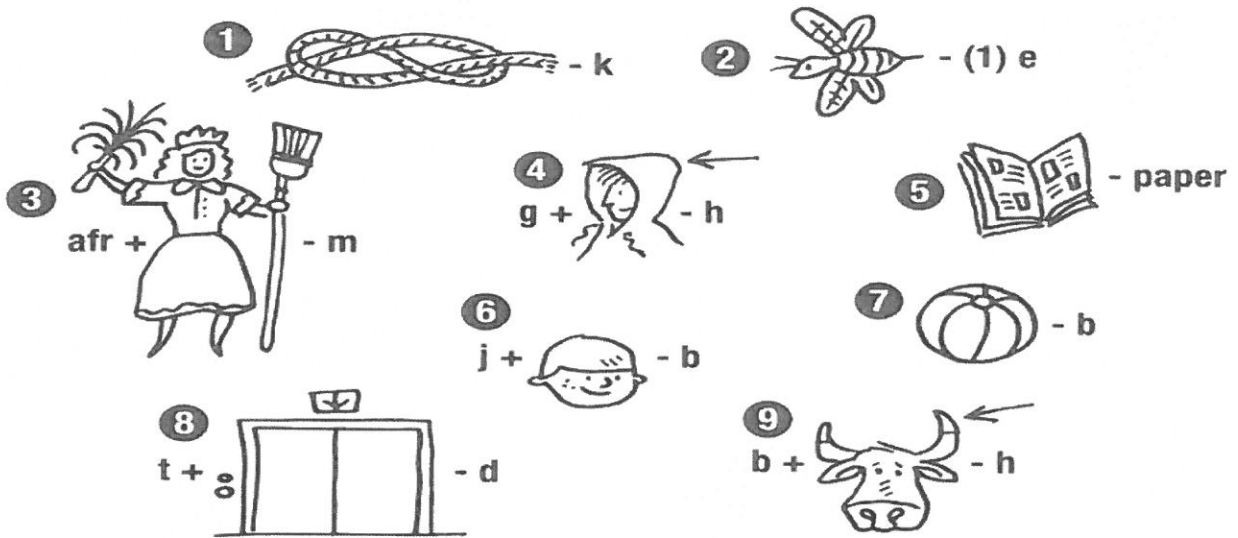
