Christians have celebrated this meal to remember how Jesus served as our Paschal lamb, the perfect sacrifice, given to rescue us from captivity and deliver us into the freedom of life with God for eternity.

We'd love for you to come share in this rich and storied meal as we remember and tell the story of God's forgiveness once again.

Families bring the kids and grandkids. We will have a special activity just for them.

Church be sure and made the Seder meal a part of your families Easter season celebration. Watch your bulletin to see when the sign-up sheets will be available.



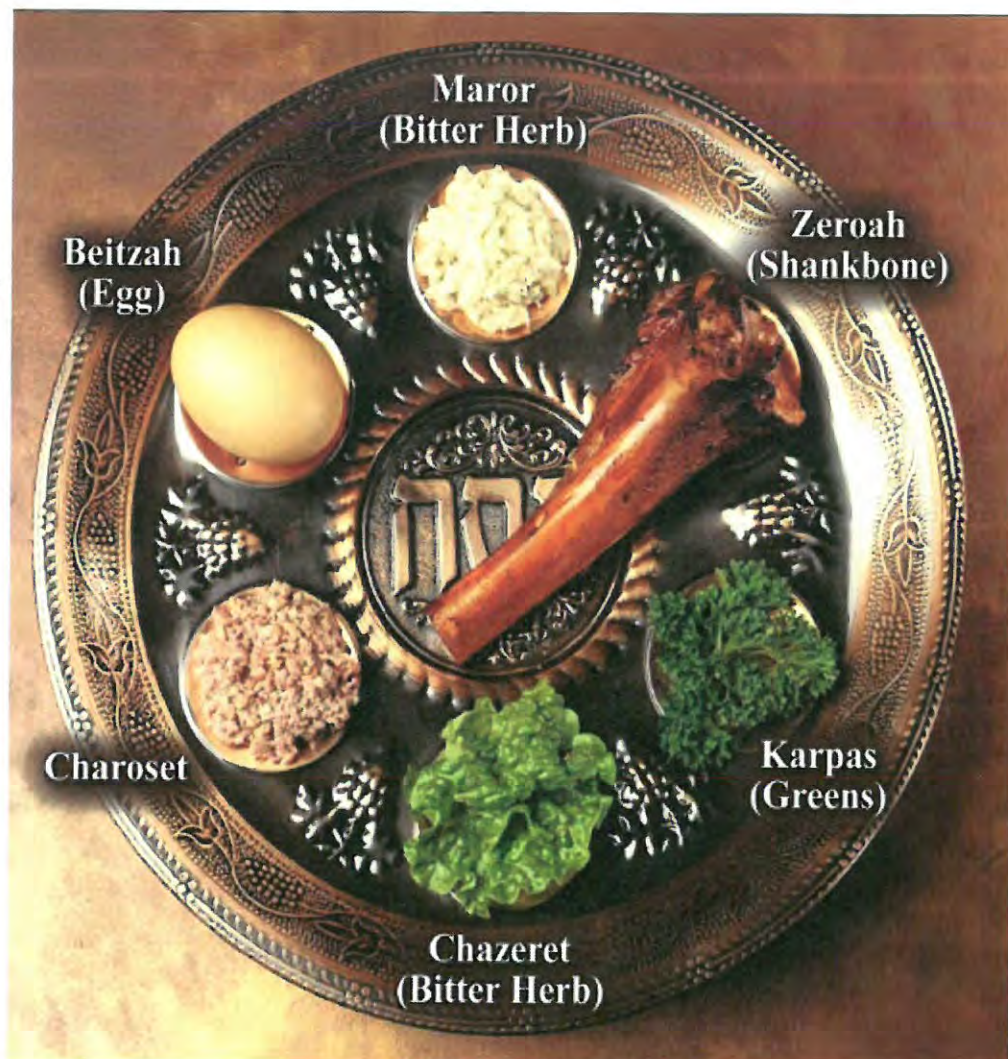

The Seder Plate Meaning

The *matzah* bread represents the bread baked without yeast which God commanded the Jews to make on the first Passover night.

A hard-boiled egg represents the festival offering and the circle of life.

The charoset, a mixture of apples, pears, nuts and wine, represents the mortar and brick made by the Jews as slaves in Egypt.



The vegetable, often parsley, represents the initial flourishing of the Israelites during the first years in Egypt.

A piece of roasted meat, often the foreleg of a lamb, represents the lamb that was slain and eaten on Passover, and whose blood was sprinkled on the doors of the Jews' homes so the death angel would "pass over" them.

Passover, which celebrates the exodus of the Jewish people from their bondage in Egypt under Pharaoh, is one of the festivals that grounds Jewish life in history and tradition. You too can celebrate it with your family, friends, and neighbors as the Jewish people have celebrated from before the time of Jesus. The *Haggadah* (the telling), which has changed little over the centuries, is our guide to the *Seder* (the order of the ceremony). Watch for the Seder sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Come experience the blessing of gathering to celebrate the Passover, just as Jesus the Messiah gathered with His disciples at the Last Supper.

“GOD’S PURPOSE FOR CONFLICT”



Have you been in any conflicts lately? Maybe you are in one now. If you're not, you know it's only a matter of time before one comes your way again. This life is filled with skirmishes, battles and wars on personal and group levels. We should not be astonished when we see ourselves and others caught in them. The conflict in our beloved UMC being a major recent one.

Does it mean God has lost control when fighting breaks out? It sure feels like it sometimes. The devil, remember we battle not against flesh and blood, is limited in what he can do because Jesus has been given all authority. “Now He is far above any ruler or authority or power or leader or anything else in this world or the world to come” (Ep. 1:21 NLT). So, if we are in any conflict, Jesus either allowed or may have even initiated it, but it is still under His control. Otherwise, He wouldn't be over everything, which He is. “The LORD has made the heavens His throne; from there He rules over everything” (Ps. 103:19 NLT).

The important question becomes, “What are Jesus' purposes for this conflict?” I guarantee you they are good, because God is good, all the time. “God is light and there is no darkness in Him at all” (Jn. 1:5b NLT). He wants to use the trouble to bring spiritual benefits to everyone involved; not just for the obvious person or people.

Since we have our own free will we can reject God's intentions. We must be willing to obey Him if we want the benefit of the problem. That makes it easier for others to receive the benefit Jesus is trying to bring them. And the focus should not be how can I change someone else involved, for only Jesus can do that, but what does He want of me? If I am faithful to that, He will work out some good for me through the conflict. “And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to His purpose for them” (Rm. 8:28 NLT).

No one wants conflict. Well, maybe some do. We want peace and unity and God wants us to have it even more than we do. As long as there are differences of opinion there will be battles, and these differences are greatly motivated by our own sinful desires. “What is causing the quarrels and fights among you? Isn't it the whole army of evil desires at war within you” (Ja. 4:1 NLT)? The only way to have perfect peace is for everyone to know the truth and accept the truth. “Let there be real harmony so there won't be divisions in the church. I plead with you to be of one mind, united in thought and purpose” (1 Co. 1:10bc NLT). That is what Jesus desires to do through the conflicts – *bring us all into perfect agreement*. At His return He will accomplish that universally.

In the meantime, we can still have peace inside us. “His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus” (Php. 4:7c NLT). And this peace comes between us and God as we accept and abide by the truths He has revealed to us.

Jesus is spreading the truth, about everything great and small. Apparently, conflicts are times of increased opportunities for us to learn truths because of our desire for peace. Seek peace, but not at the expense of truth, and don't be surprised when conflict comes. “Dear friends, don't be surprised by the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you” (Pt. 4:12 NLT). *God is up to something good!*

Operation Christmas Child

Because of the generosity of donors in the United States, Operation Christmas Child collected **10,623,776** shoeboxes in 2018. They were sent to over 112 countries and territories, plus 24 hard to reach countries. The names of the countries are not given for security reasons.

Recently we were able to purchase beanie babies, and many toys from the Dollar General which had buy 1 toy and receive 2 free. What a blessing!! We will be collecting **erasers and pencil sharpeners** for shoe boxes in **March and April**. The collection box is by the church office.

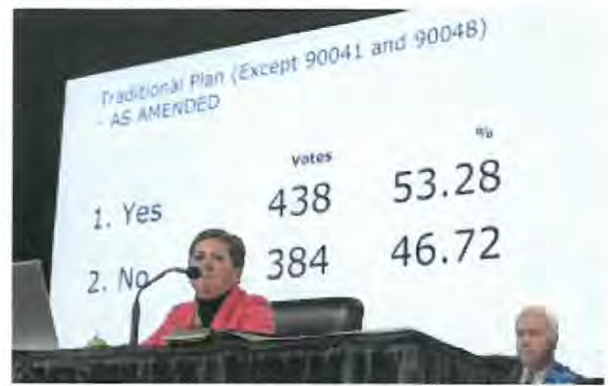

WHAT GENERAL CONFERENCE ACCOMPLISHED

February 26, 2019 By [Good News](#)

Here is a brief summary of the accomplishments of the special called 2019 General Conference of The United Methodist Church held in St. Louis.

Given the opportunity to support the full court press of the majority of North American bishops in their advocacy of the One Church Plan, a decisive majority of delegates instead chose the Traditional Plan.



- By a vote of 438 to 384 (53.3 percent), adopted the Traditional Plan, parts of which will not be able to go into effect because they are unconstitutional. Parts that **will** go into effect are:
- Expanded definition of “self-avowed homosexuals” to include persons living in a same-sex marriage or union or who publicly proclaim themselves to be practicing homosexuals
- Explicitly prohibits bishops from consecrating bishops, ordaining or commissioning clergy who are self-avowed practicing homosexuals
- Requires all persons nominated to serve on the annual conference board of ordained ministry to certify that they will uphold and enforce the *Book of Discipline’s* standards for ordained clergy
- Establishes a minimum penalty for clergy convicted of performing a same-sex wedding of a one year suspension (first offense) and loss of credentials (second offense)
- Explicitly prohibits district committee and conference board of ministry from recommending a candidate for ministry who does not meet the standards, and orders the bishop to declare any such unqualified candidate out of order
- Prohibits a bishop from arbitrarily dismissing a complaint against a clergy person
- Requires the involvement of the complainant in all stages of the resolution process and that every effort must be made to have the complainant agree to any just resolution
- Allows the church to appeal the verdict of a trial court in cases of egregious errors of church law or administration
- Petitions defining how clergy pensions are to be handled when a clergy person or congregation leaves the denomination
- An exit path for congregations seeking to leave the denomination with their property, in exchange for one (extra) year’s apportionments and payment of pension liabilities. This legislation will not go into effect because it is believed to be unconstitutional.
- All constitutional defects in the various pieces of legislation could have been fixed with simple amendments. But stalling tactics by proponents of the One Church Plan prevented these important amendments to be enacted. It would be possible to pass them at the 2020 General Conference next year.
- Defeated the One Church Plan by a vote of 374 to 449 (54.6 percent opposed)
- The most vitriolic atmosphere ever at an annual conference, with even leading centrists engaging in hateful rhetoric, lies, and character assassination, casting doubt on their claim to want to live together in one church body.

God's Faithfulness

Back in the summer of 1975, when I was just a little over a year old in the Lord, I was at a month-long discipleship camp sponsored by Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship (IVCF) on the beautiful shore of Lake Huron in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Our little IV chapter at the main campus of Kent had just been established the previous year with 7 persons (me included) and the help of an IV staff person. It seemed like we had done everything to see it grow without a whole lot of success.

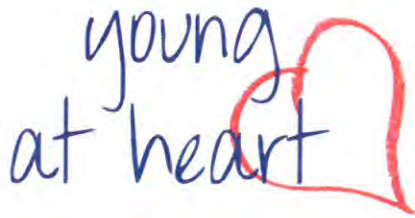
As I was praying about chapter growth on that shore, God gave me the verse "Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass." 1 Thess. 5:24. It was a verse He would remind me of throughout the following years as He blessed and multiplied our chapter. At our first large group meeting the following fall, we had about 100 attend (previously, we were lucky to have 20). We would lead several evangelistic and discipleship Bible studies in many dorms and see students come to know Him. It was an exciting time. And the lesson I learned was this, that when God calls me to something, I need to trust Him to lead, to provide, and to show me the next steps. Success does not necessarily come in my timing, nor does it come without struggle.

As I think about this calling I have for Haiti, I see so many similarities and am reminded of the lessons learned during my college days. We are needing to trust Him to lead, to provide and to show us the next steps. Regarding provision, I am very grateful for how God has moved in so many of you to support the Haiti missions trip financially. Thank you for coming a long side of our small Haiti team and helping us reach almost \$5000 through our fundraisers and giving almost \$1900 in extra offerings. It is amazing and I praise God! Our last two fundraisers are a scrapbooking event this weekend and a rummage sale scheduled for 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Saturday, April 6. These last fundraisers will go toward meeting our \$10,000 goal for this trip.

The Haiti trip will also be designated as the Mission of the Month for March and we are planning that most of those funds will be used for ministry. Ministry money in the past three years we have gone has been for VBS supplies, hymnals, and construction project expenses –materials and workers for repair and building of homes, a school and a trade school.

In closing, I do not know all of what God wants to do through our team. Good works is obviously a part, but I believe this is just one part of His bigger plan for the community of Manze Marie and there is more yet to be revealed. Thanks for joining and supporting us on this journey.

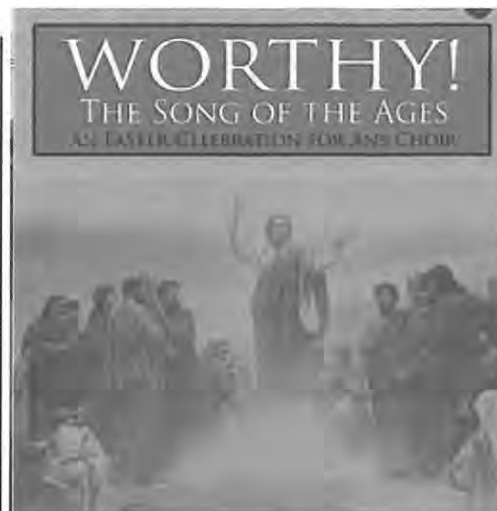

A worldview is the lens through which someone interprets the world around him. For Christians, our entire understanding of the world and how we are to live in it is supposed to be filtered through Jesus, His Word, and the Holy Spirit. The good life, as I define it, is what an individual sees as the ideal way to live life—the best possible life that will bring the most happiness, meaning, and purpose.

Though the world may say that the good life is achieved through personal success, the Christian knows that there is no such thing as personal success. The Christian worldview teaches us that success in life is defined by our ability to depend 100% on the power of Jesus working inside us.

The world teaches that a pleasing or popular external image is the path to the good life. Reality is much different. The more our world focuses on outward appearances, the less "good" life is. God says, "Look at the inside." His good life requires a complete and total internal makeover.

We are just over half way through this lesson and are excited to see where it takes us. On a side note, I'm happy to announce that 3 more of our youth have made the decision to take membership classes. Seeing our youth grow and mature in their faith has been a wonderful blessing!

Your Witness—Revealing Victory In Jesus - by Don Gibson

It's been said Satan doesn't mind Christians as long as they remain powerless. What Satan (the deceiver) doesn't like—people whose lives are a witness of victory in Jesus. That victory rests on the finished work of Jesus Christ. And it is ours if we believe in Christ and seek Christ as our source of victory. 1 Corinthians 15:57-58 tell us, *"But thanks be to God, **which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ**. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that **your labour is not in vain in the Lord**."*

Our labor? What is that? It's the labor for Christ that God and others see in our lives. It's our witness that we are His children. What's the evidence? **"For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace."** Romans 6:14. A life under the power of sin does not reflect the power of God. But a life in God's grace reveals victory. And God actually does the work—through us. God doesn't leave us hanging. He's with us. He's in us. He even labors with us when we serve Him. **"For we are laborers together with God..."** 1 Corinthians 3:9a. Therein lies the victory.

What about in new circumstances, or circumstances that seem harder than we've ever experienced? In the flesh, it's easy to feel defeated, or even as if we are in a lost cause. But God is ahead of us. He's got it covered. Where? Of course...in His Word. **"Christ in you, the hope of glory."** Colossians 1:27b. Our lives in Christ glorify God.

But sometimes our labor in Christ comes with trials. That doesn't negate John 10:10b where Jesus speaks of His sheep, **"I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly."** And what does Jesus mean by "abundantly"? A rich day-to-day life in the Spirit—free from sin's condemnation. *"There is therefore now **no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.**"* Romans 8:1-2.

But we say, "God's grace sounds good, But I'm not sure I have enough faith for all that." That's Satan talking. But the truth is that God gives us our faith. We cannot manufacture it. Even better, it's Christ's faith that we live by—and that's how our lives are a witness for the victory in Jesus. Remember this verse? **"I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."** Galatians 2:20. Wherever our Spiritual walk, there's victory, and more—in Christ.
