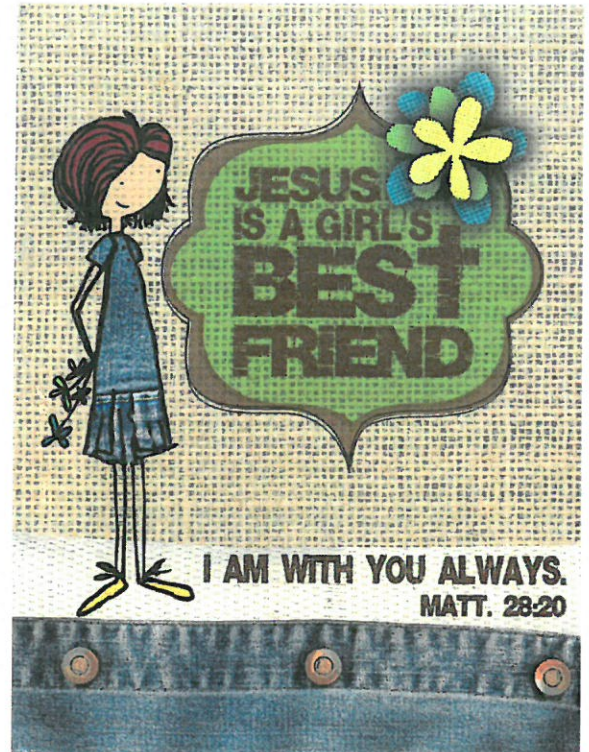

May Mission of the Month: Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County

The mission of the Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County is

to assist families and individuals in a faith-based environment to achieve stability, sobriety and permanent housing. They strive to provide them with the tools and services they need to find and retain employment and stable housing. They do this through support and education.

Friends of the Homeless Shelter of Tuscarawas County operates the county's only emergency homeless shelter. The shelter has a maximum capacity of 36 persons, with separate dormitories for single men and women, and five family rooms. Since opening in October 2005, they have provided over 100,000 bed nights to those experiencing homelessness in and around Tuscarawas County. In efforts to prevent residents from becoming homeless again and returning to the shelter once they secure stable housing, they provide access to a number of programs that address some of the underlying causes of homelessness. They assess every individual upon intake, and link them to the appropriate agencies, such as primary care doctors, mental health professionals, personal and/or substance abuse counselors, parenting classes, housing assistance, and job skills training. They work with Kent State University, Stark State College, and the Compass Center to provide residents with on-site life skills groups that focus on teaching the skills needed to secure and maintain stable housing and employment.

Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County does not manufacture and sell a product, or sell a service. They have no way to earn an income. Their product is a second chance at living for those who desperately need it, and they gladly give that product to anyone who needs it and is willing to change and learn. As a result, they are constantly short of money to operate. They are in dire need of additional funding. We have had a long hard winter with extreme temperatures. All beds were full at the Shelter this winter and law enforcement would bring even more people who are out on the street in sub-freezing weather. They would take them in even if they had no place but the floor to sleep.

“CLOSE THE CANON”



There are a couple terms I want to look at as we keep up with the ongoing doctrinal debate in our United Methodist Church. Healthy debate is necessary as we seek one mind in nonessentials, but there are essentials of the faith that should already be settled. Wouldn't it be wonderful if UM's could agree on the essentials? Now, that would be a good study for some official task force.

The terms I want to bring up are "progressive theology" and "process theology". I think they both refer to basically the same belief system. That is, God is still revealing new truths and even changing old truths. In other words, truth, by the Spirit of God, is evolving. I may not understand everything meant by those espousing this theology, but I think I'm close. I would say they are trampling upon the essentials of the faith.

One of the major difficulties I have with this theology is the belief that God is using His people as the instruments for new and changing truths. This means that they believe God is using His people to create His Word, the Holy Scriptures, and our Canon. Mark Dever, in his book, *Nine Marks of a Healthy Church*, said, **"God's people have never created God's Word. From the beginning, God's Word has always created His people."** I agree.

If God is continuing to reveal higher truths, which truths are changing? What are the new truths? To whom is He giving these new revelations? Can we gather church leaders from around the globe to make these truths clear to the rest of us? Who would listen?

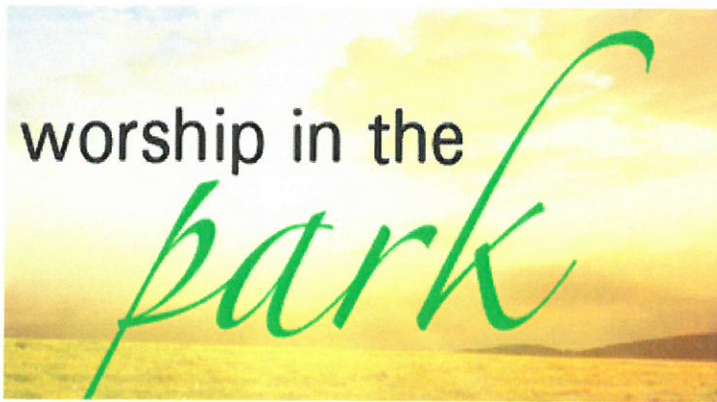
I cannot see progressive theology leading to anything but confusion and division. That is exactly what it is doing. Surely, God can see clearly into the future and recognize this. His plan would not divide His Church. He wouldn't keep changing truth, His Word, or the Canon.

We absolutely need a standard for truth, and God has given to us. We call it the Bible. If we start changing the Bible the church will drift apart even more than it has. Everybody and their brother would have a different opinion on most everything. It is tough enough to get those of us who believe the Bible is inerrant in the original autographs to agree on everything, but we do come together around certain basic beliefs.

I've been a part of weekly pastor's fellowships for most of my 34 years in ministry. Those who stayed faithful in these groups were from more than fifteen different denominations. The major uniting factors for us have always been Jesus, the Bible and a trust in never changing truth. You name the topic and we've probably discussed it. When we would come to agree on what the Bible said, the discussion was settled. What a blessing!

Some who visited our fellowships relied on other sources for truth. They never hung around long. "Can two people walk together without agreeing on the direction?" (Amos 3:3 NLT). I'd like to think we showed them respect even when everyone knew the Bible wasn't their final authority. They just didn't fit. Other fellowships have been forced together by other factors, but being like-minded brings true unity. "Finally, all of you should be of one mind" (1 Peter 3:8 NLT).

Progressive theology in some form or another has been around a long time, even though the term is fairly new. Some are now refining its specific beliefs and those with like minds will band together with them. It will only bring deeper division to our denomination and other churches. To be one with God we must unite in the revealed will of God, His eternal Word-- the Bible. Close the Canon.

Your Witness—Overcoming Fear of the Big “No” - by Don Gibson

Ever felt you were about to hear a “No” when talking with someone about Christ? Me too. It’s normal because Satan tries to discourage us. Even Jesus himself experienced it. In the Gospel of John 1:10 ***“He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.*** Ironic, isn’t it? Christ made the world but it did not know him. Actually, that’s why he came to save us, because people don’t know him. In the next verse, (11) ***“He came unto his own, and his own received him not.”*** So his own people, the Jews, not only didn’t know him but they didn’t received him. Wow! So what do we have a tendency to do? Do we conclude we’re up against resistance and choose to not bring up Christ or simply make a light-hearted remark, instead?

So why witness? Because there’s power in our conversation when it contains God’s Word, according to the Bible. Great things happen, even if we don’t see it. John 1 goes on to say in verse 12, ***“But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:”*** See that? Power. He gives us power (His Spiritual power) to witness and he gives the person with whom we are speaking power to become a believer. Re-read V12. It’s there. God GIVES the power! Do we believe it, or do we believe how we feel when Satan lies to us through ***“...principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places,” says Ephesians 6:12.*** Ahhhh, God’s on top of that, too with Ephesians 6:14 ***“Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness;”*** So might this reduce our fear when talking with others about the Lord, Jesus? It does for me, when I read the Word so it’s enabling me Spiritually to serve him. Let’s see if we get this. We do the labor of revealing Christ, revealing our peace in Christ, and Christ does the hard part. He provides the power. Cool! God says it for us in 1 Corinthians 15:57-58, ***“But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.”***

Let’s make sure we get that last phrase in the verse, too. Our labor is not in vain in the Lord. That means if we stand fast in the Word of God, and use the Word of God, our conversation with others about Christ accomplishes something for God. And God will do the rest. In John 1:23, John said, ***“I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness.”*** That’s all we are—a voice. We may not see advancing results right away every time, but that doesn’t mean God didn’t plant a seed. However, you will see great results often. Because God wants we believers to see him working in people’s hearts. Thank God we do.

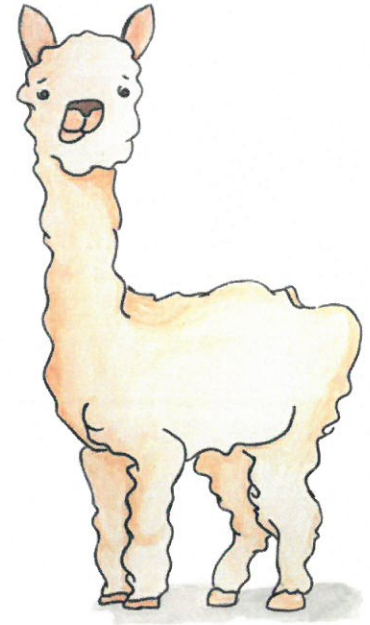
Alpaca shoebox won't you paca shoe box with me.

God of Relationships

“And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.” John 1:14

Our God is a God of relationships. He came to the earth and ate our bread, smelled our bleating sheep, walked our dusty roads, saw our blind and lame, touched our little children and heard our noisy crowds. He ***dwelt among us***. It would have been so much easier for Him to not leave His throne, to not, literally, get His hands dirty, to not confront the Pharisees and scribes face-to-face, to not heal sickly bodies with His touch. But our God is not that kind of God. He is personal and cares about each person He has created.

And like the compassionate Father He is, He wants us to come to Him and share with Him everything – all our joys, frustrations and concerns. He loves us and is our example of what we need to be like. Since He is a God of relationships, we ought to also care about building relationships.

This June will be our fourth time to go to Haiti. Each year, we have returned to the same mountain village of Manze Marie in southern Haiti to build relationships with the people. We are laying a foundation for ministry to the people – learning about their community, learning the children’s names and who their family members are, learning their culture and language and most of all showing God’s love ***in person***.

It startled me the first time we were there and the Pastor called us missionaries. When I think of the word missionaries, I think of someone quite dedicated and holy totally committed to a place and its people to share the gospel. But as I thought about it some more, I realized we were missionaries. We were being sent by our church to do good works, to demonstrate His love in concrete, practical ways and to share His Word. It is a great privilege and honor to build relationships as God has done and is still doing all over the world and I am very thankful that we belong to a church which has supported us. We are going in person, following the example of the One who did not love from a distance, but who thought it important enough to leave everything and give everything, even His life for us, and come to us. Praise be to God!

June Mission of the Month: Red Bird Mission



The Red Bird area of Kentucky is deep in the Appalachian Mountains. The rugged mountains make for beautiful scenery, but also difficult transportation, little employment, and extreme poverty. The Eastern Appalachian Mountains in Kentucky have some of the poorest counties in America. Today the need remains critical in this isolated, rural distressed area. Chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing, and rugged mountainous terrain provide obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area. Red Bird Mission and Clinic strives to meet needs through ministry in five areas: Education, Health and Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement.

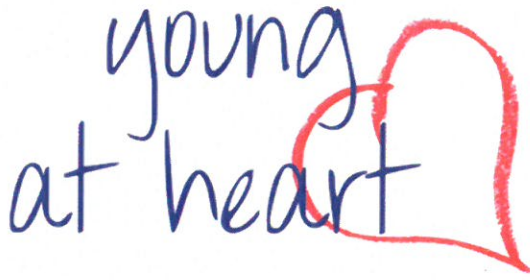
Red Bird Mission is located near the tiny post office of Beverly, KY. Founded with just a school in 1921, today it has grown to a full-service mission of the United Methodist Church, the only one of its kind in the U.S. It serves approximately 14,000 people each year.

The story of Red Bird is one of deep faith in God. Red Bird Mission was born in answer to prayer. It is a story of gracious outpouring of prayer and means by the church.

Mission staff members hold deep respect for the local culture. Many grew up there, graduated from Red Bird Mission School, and are currently raising families there. People at Red Bird are very family oriented; they own their land; relatives and several generations are likely to reside near each other. People there take care of their own; even though there's a very high homeless rate, you don't see it because multiple generations and multiple families may live in one house. The people are very proud and resilient.

The Education ministries are carried out through a PreK-12 school. These education ministries provide the opportunity for the children and youth of this community to get a quality education in a loving Christian environment empowering these young people with tools that will help them escape this cycle of poverty in which they are exposed to and live in daily.

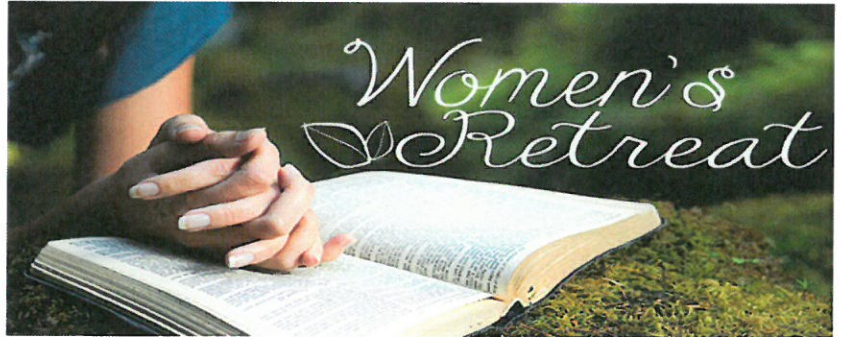

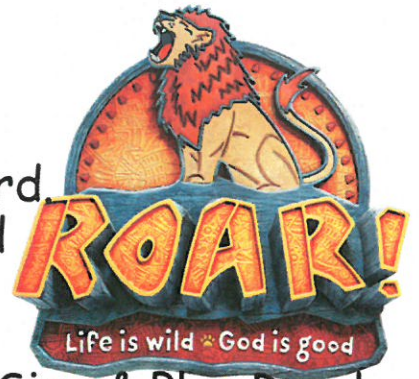

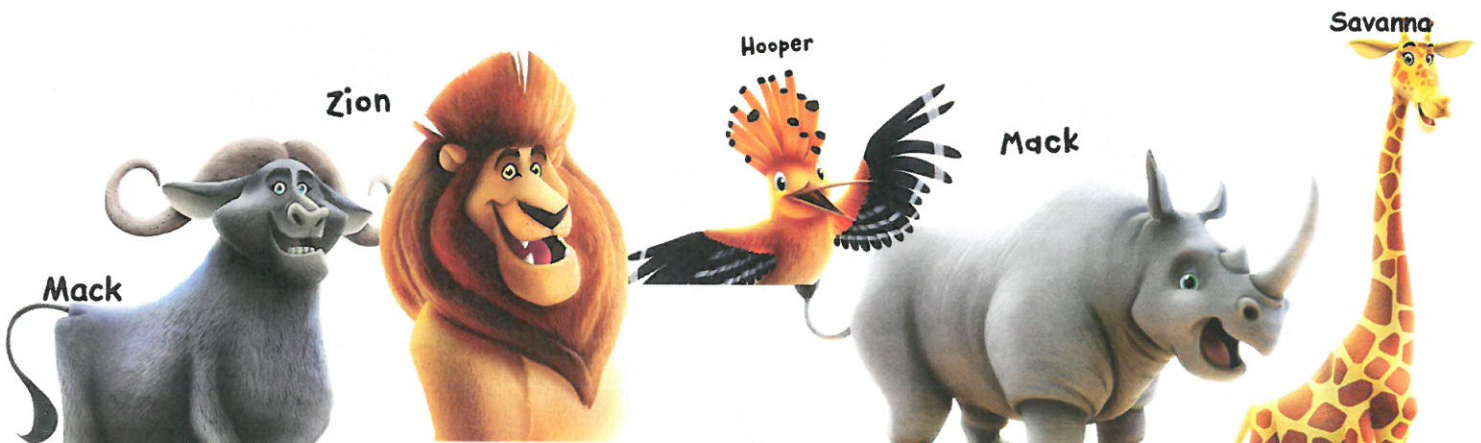

Your Witness—Revealing Victory In Jesus - by Don Gibson

It's been said Satan doesn't mind Christians as long as they remain powerless. What Satan (the deceiver) doesn't like—people whose lives are a witness of victory in Jesus. That victory rests on the finished work of Jesus Christ. And it is ours if we believe in Christ and seek Christ as our source of victory. 1 Corinthians 15:57-58 tell us, "*But thanks be to God, **which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ**. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that **your labour is not in vain in the Lord**.*"

Our labor? What is that? It's the labor for Christ that God and others see in our lives. It's our witness that we are His children. What's the evidence? "***For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace.***" Romans 6:14. A life under the power of sin does not reflect the power of God. But a life in God's grace reveals victory. And God actually does the work—through us. God doesn't leave us hanging. He's with us. He's in us. He even labors with us when we serve Him. "***For we are laborers together with God...***" 1 Corinthians 3:9a. Therein lies the victory.

What about in new circumstances, or circumstances that seem harder than we've ever experienced? In the flesh, it's easy to feel defeated, or even as if we are in a lost cause. But God is ahead of us. He's got it covered. Where? Of course...in His Word. "***Christ in you, the hope of glory.***" Colossians 1:27b. Our lives in Christ glorify God.

But sometimes our labor in Christ comes with trials. That doesn't negate John 10:10b where Jesus speaks of His sheep, "***I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.***" And what does Jesus mean by "abundantly"? A rich day-to-day life in the Spirit—free from sin's condemnation. "*There is therefore now **no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.***" Romans 8:1-2.

But we say, "God's grace sounds good, But I'm not sure I have enough faith for all that." That's Satan talking. But the truth is that God gives us our faith. We cannot manufacture it. Even better, it's Christ's faith that we live by—and that's how our lives are a witness for the victory in Jesus. Remember this verse? "***I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.***" Galatians 2:20. Wherever our Spiritual walk, there's victory, and more—in Christ.
