## “THE TRUTH ABOUT SANTA”

I don't have many memories from my preschool years, but one I do have is about Santa Claus. I was either four or five at the time and it was Christmas Eve. Dad, Mom and sister Gay were in bed asleep. My mind was racing with thoughts of the next morning and the different gifts that could be under the tree.

I got out of bed and quietly went downstairs to the front room. There under the tree were some wrapped gifts I had already seen and some unwrapped gifts I hadn't seen. My heart was pounding. After checking out the unwrapped gifts I went to the large picture window, leaned on the sill and looked up into the starry sky. I started thinking about how I must have just missed Santa bringing those unwrapped toys that were under our tree. I thought that he must be up in the sky in his sleigh with the reindeer at that very moment. As I stared into the sky, I saw them—the sleigh and the reindeer. It might have been a plane or just my imagination, but my great desire to see Santa, mixed with the power of suggestion, made it a real event for me. I believed it.

I don't remember who told me, I think it was one of the kids at school, but when they said Santa wasn't real, I just couldn't accept it. I was confused, hurt, and wasn't sure how to respond. Eventually I was convinced. All those books read to me and programs I'd seen telling me about Santa were not true. The adults had lied to me.

I was about that same age when I was sure I saw a ghost at the foot of my bed in the middle of the night. Somehow I got around him, over my sister's bed, and into Dad and Mom's room. They tried to convince me that ghosts weren't real—I just had a nightmare. I wouldn't believe them. There was no way I was going back to my bed that night! The ghost never bothered Gay; she was still there in the morning. I slept the rest of the night right between Dad and Mom. I wasn't sure I could believe them.

The line between what's true and what's false is crucial. It has everything to do with what we believe, what we do and say, and who we are. That's why Christian parents often struggle with how to deal with the “Santa Claus” question and similar issues. The Christmas season can serve as a great opportunity to teach children the difference between fantasy and fact. Beck and I raised our kids to believe the Bible is true and Jesus is real. By the same token we were careful to explain to them that Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny and the Tooth Fairy were all fictional characters—games people play.

Parents can allow their children to enjoy all the “extras” associated with the Christmas season without deliberately misleading them. I believe it is important for kids to understand that their gifts come from people who love them and not from some mythical person who rewards good behavior. It is a great benefit for children to know their parents are people who do their best to be honest and truthful. When that foundation is laid early in a child's life, it can have enormous benefits and blessings later.

*“Everything I say is right, for I speak the truth and detest every kind of deception” (Pr. 8:6-7 NLT).* This is wisdom speaking to all ages—not just adults.

## **Your Witness—Christmas is Coming; So Is Christ!** - by Don Gibson

How many of us have heard Pastor Mick greet us or say good-bye with “**Maranatha**” countless times. He’s faithful to God and his to witness for Christ. “Maranatha” acknowledges the Lord’s soon coming. It says, “I’m looking forward to it.”

And when it comes to Christmas each year, it seems there are two general responses people have about Christmas coming. Either “I can’t wait!” Or, “I can’t believe Christmas is here already—I’ll never be ready with so much to do.”

**My point? Christmas is coming; so is Christ.** So as believers in Christ, why not link the two together as part of our witness? Christmas celebrates Christ’s birth as our Savior; Christ’s next return is more. It’s the rapture of the church—when Christ returns in the air to call out His church to be with Him forever. Hallelujah! Seems we’ve recently heard three sermons on the rapture (October 13-14-15. CD’s and DVD’s available from Tammy in the office). Here’s the truth of the rapture: 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18...

*16 For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:*

*17 Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.*

*18 Wherefore comfort one another with these words.*

**Do we get that? Comfort one another with these words.** So throughout November and most of December, what’s our witness? Yes, Christmas is coming, but so is Christ! In fact, that Christ is coming is our witness from hereon; with believers and with the world. Let’s comfort one another through Christmastime. **As we wish others a Merry Christmas, let’s also wish them, “Maranatha—Christ Himself is coming again! Hallelujah!** Saying that and being ready to discuss it with believers and non-believers is being faithful to God and to our witness for Christ. Personally, I like to read it, hear it, speak it. It comforts me.

To non-believers at Christmastime, **I can’t think of a better door-opener to talk about Christ and being ready for His return.** It’s a natural extension of “Merry Christmas”. If people reply “Maranatha” joyfully, we probably just blessed a Christian. If people reply “What’s that?”, I’m going to tell them Christ is returning for His church and I’m looking forward to it. I’ll ask, “Do you ever think about that?” Their answer is our guide to learn of their faith—to join believers to rejoice in the truth, or to help non-believers discover that Christ can become their Savior at Christmas. What a connection! What a witness!

## Waiting and Believing in God

*“Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; yes, wait for the Lord.” Psalm 27:14*

As mentioned in my last newsletter article and bulletin announcements, the 2019 Haiti Missions trip has been postponed to 2020 due to the country's unrest. The flights have now been rescheduled for July 11-17, 2020. Due to the church's generosity, there is enough in the trip fund to pay for all the expenses of next year's trip and for ministry projects. Praise God! Thank you for your faithful support.

The next several months will be a time of waiting – waiting for God to reveal what He wants to do with us, how He wants to use us. It will be a time of prayer seeking political stability and safety for Haiti. We have so much to be thankful for in our country in contrast. While our trip has been affected, I have thought often about the many Haitians and established ministries there that are being affected by the increased costs of basic goods. Please join us in prayer for Haiti's people as well as the many ministries there.

It would be easy to worry that the situation will not get better. This is the poorest country in the western hemisphere that has been plagued by spiritual warfare (voodooism) and corrupt leaders all of its history. But, we have a God who is so great and powerful “Even from eternity I am He; and there is none who can deliver out of My hand; I act and who can reverse it?” (Isaiah 41:13). “Behold, the nations are like a *drop from a bucket*, and are regarded as a *speck of dust* on the scales; behold, He lifts up the islands like fine dust.” (Isaiah 40:15). So when we look at a situation that seems hopeless, even a country that seems hopeless, it is not hopeless for God. Satan may seem to triumph for a moment, but God is sovereign. His will cannot be thwarted. **It is never thwarted.**

However, waiting for God's will to be revealed is not easy. It would be nice if He was into sky writing His will, but that is not how He works. Sometimes, it is in the waiting that our trust in Him is made stronger. Our longing to hear should lead us to seek Him in prayer and in that time, if we listen for His voice, He can also reaffirm our faith.

Please pray for our faith and trust in Him for this trip as we wait.

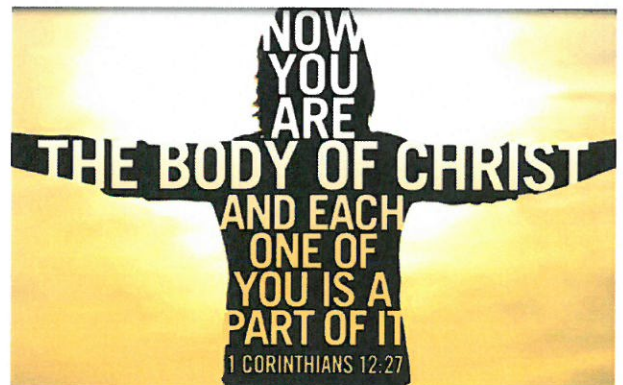

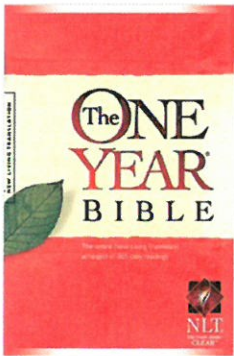
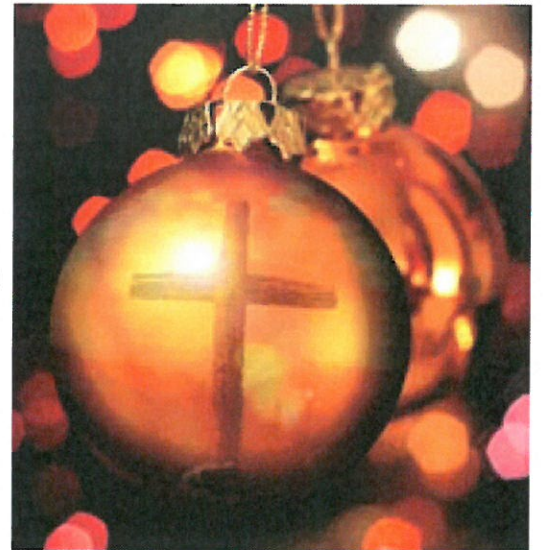

We have placed a large bin in Spencer Hall to place your donations. We will accept donations until **Sunday, November 24.**

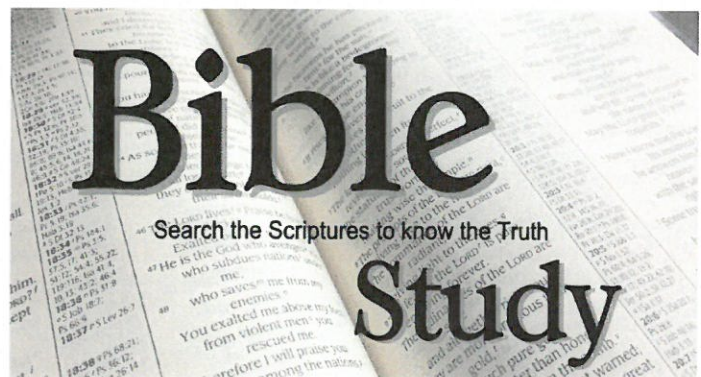

## December Mission of the Month: Voice of the Martyrs

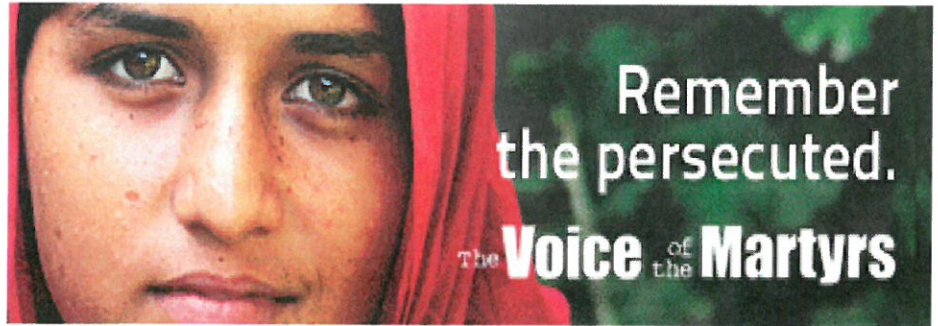
The December mission of the month will be Voice of the Martyrs. They are a

nonprofit Christian missions organization dedicated to serving our persecuted family worldwide through practical and spiritual assistance and leading other members of the body of Christ into fellowship with them.

VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned for 14 years in Communist Romania for his faith in Christ; his wife, Sabina, was imprisoned for three years. In 1965 they were ransomed out of Romania, and soon thereafter they established the global network of missions of which VOM is a part. The Wurmbrands based these missions on **Hebrews 13:3**, which instructs us to ***“Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being your selves also in the body.”***

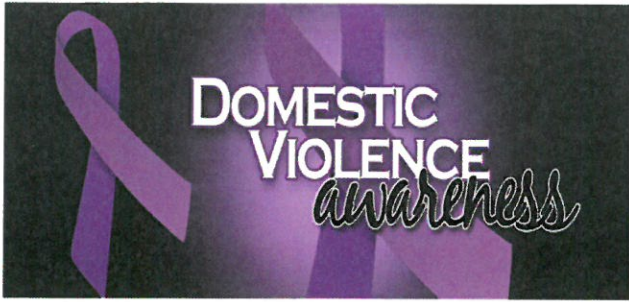

## Thanksgiving Mission: Harbor House

Alarming statistics indicate that, as you read this short sentence, a woman has become the victim of assault. According to the Partnership Against Domestic Violence, every 9 seconds, another woman in the U.S. is beaten.

*Every nine seconds.*

It's a sobering reality for one in four women in the U.S. will experience domestic violence in their lifetime, most frequently by someone they know. Female victims most commonly first experience domestic violence between the

**ages of 18-24 (38.6%)**

**age 11-17 (22.4%)**

**age 35-44 (6.8%)**

**age 45+ (2.5%).**

Almost one out of five or 16.3% of murder victims in the U.S. were killed by an intimate partner; women account for two out of three murder victims killed by an intimate partner.

Violence against women occurs predominantly behind closed doors at home with most cases having never been reported to police. But that doesn't mean the problem isn't visible and doesn't spill into future generations. Domestic violence is the third leading cause of homelessness among families with 50% of all women who are homeless reporting that domestic violence was the immediate cause of their homelessness, according to The National Center on Family Homelessness.

Survivors of domestic violence often flee abuse with nothing more than the clothes on their backs. Traumatized and fearful, they turn to local domestic violence programs for refuge from relentless abuse they faced at the hands of their partner. Most shelters provide survivors everything they need to start over from bedding and towels to toothbrushes and shampoo. And they do it for free!

**3.3 Million:** Estimated number of children in the U.S. each year that witness violence against their mother or female caretaker by a family member.

**40-60:** Percentage of men who abuse women also abuse children.

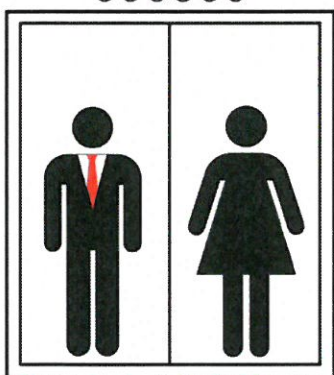
## New Philadelphia Christmas Lighting Ceremony Friday, November 22

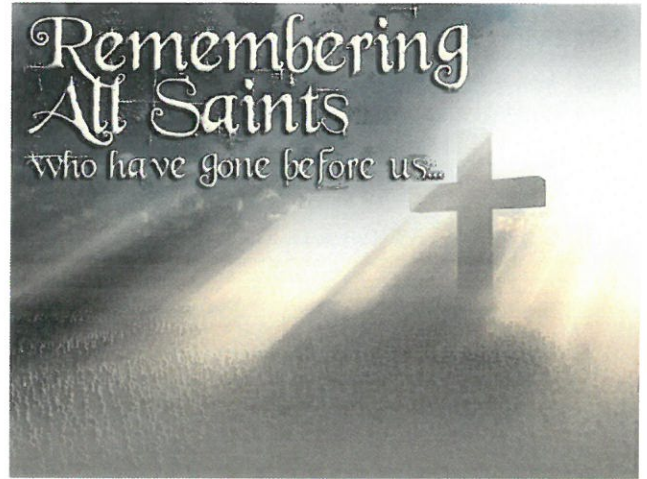
## **ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY**

The following guidelines are to determine those to be recognized on this important day on the Christian calendar.

1. Current members of Broadway Church who have attended regularly.
2. Current members of Broadway Church who could not attend regularly due to illness or distance. Consideration shall be given to the length of absence whether family members will attend the All Saints' Sunday observance.
3. Former members whose spiritual influence is still felt within the Broadway Church family. Consideration shall be given as to whether family members will attend the All Saints' Sunday observance.
4. Those persons who are not members of Broadway but were presently active in the life of our local church at the time of their deaths. Consideration shall be given if illness has kept them from attending.
5. Former pastors of Broadway Church.

Discretion in working within these guidelines shall lie with the Pastor.
