“THE PRIORITY OF THE CHURCH”

Some time ago I was golfing with two pastor buddies, Dave and Bob. We were talking about life in our churches, as we usually do. Bob said, “The church is our life, but it is just one of many activities to our people.” That statement kept coming back to my mind. Is it true?

As I look back to the time before I was a pastor, I remember that Becky and I planned each week around church life. We gave highest priority to Sunday Worship and allowed nothing else to interfere, not even family or kids’ activities. We also cherish memories from Sunday School, special services at our church, being a part of our church’s ministries, and just hanging out with others in our church family. We also treasure past Christian activities outside our church, like revivals, working with other churches, seminars, and parachurch ministries.

I can’t say that we made a decision at a certain point in time to give highest priority to the Body of Christ, it just happened. Our times in the church have been crucial to where Jesus has us today. He has given us many very pleasant memories. We wouldn’t trade them for anything and we continue to make sweet new ones with believers here.

What moved us to change our lifestyle? It was those Christians. I like them; they are good people—the best! I like to be around them, especially those who like to talk about Jesus. They want to Please Him; their aim is to be like Him—mine too! “If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have *fellowship* one with another” (1 John 1:7 KJV). That’s it. As the scripture says, we’re just some *fellows* traveling in the same *ship*.

What makes our ship different from the others on the sea? Mainly, it’s the Captain—Jesus. He rescued us from drowning in our sins. What a Savior! There is no one I’d rather live for. He saved my life. So, now my life belongs to Him—His family, His Body, His church—along with those in the same ship. Those relationships not part of His church that I am involved in, simply place me where I can throw the Lifeline to others who are drowning.

Is that the way everyone in my flock looks at the church when they compare it to other interests in their life? Maybe not; they just haven’t given Jesus Christ and His church top priority in their lives; they haven’t gotten to know Him and His family well enough—YET.

Life in the church surpasses anything this world has to offer, and the benefits continue forever. Jesus didn’t provide His church for only pastors and their families to build their lives around, but for everyone He has rescued from life’s restless sea. It not only provides a pleasant cruise, but it is the only ship that will still be floating when the storms of life are over.

Your Witness: Our Real Question—Our Real Witness - by Don Gibson

You just found out. You have cancer. You lost your job. A friend is hurting. Your marriage is weaker than you thought. Something's wrong. It goes on—the things that COULD happen—to you and me as Christians, to our family and friends. Big things. Little things.

What's the first thing to do? Panic? Become fearful? No! The first thing to do is to realize that God is calling us through these things. ***"Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give thee rest."* Matthew 11:28.** Put another way, the first thing to do is to love God; to hate sin; to believe God's promises; to have the faith that God gives us and calls us to; to be walking in the Spirit as God instructs believers to do. ***"But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe. Galatians 3:22. "This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh. Galatians 5:16.*** So God enables us to walk with Him. But if we wait till troubles surface, it's late. God calls us to salvation. God calls us to walk with Him. Always. Before, through and after trials. But not only when we perceive a specific incident in life happens that we think we can't handle alone. God has already been calling us. It doesn't stop. Wherever we are in our faith-walk, God's calling us to a closer walk with Him. ***"...every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit."* John 15:2a.** And a closer walk with God is a more obedient walk with God. Even Jesus experienced suffering to become more obedient. ***"Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered; Hebrews 5:8.***

Yes. I've had the wake-up calls in life. So have you. What's the first thing to do? Ask God the real question. O God, speak to me. Will you show me what you want me to understand, to start doing? to stop doing? Is my life in you bearing fruit—our very purpose? How do we ask that? For me...through prayer while studying the Bible. God speaks to us as we search the Scriptures with our heart of repentance and tenderness.

So here's at least one right question. "Is my heart set on bearing fruit? Jesus is calling us to answer that. ***"I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing."* John 15:5.** And he's calling us to follow Him. Where does He lead us? ***"...Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men."*** Our life's purpose is to bear fruit. There's our peace. ***"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."* John 14:27.** Ask the question. My testimony is this. I've been there, done that; just as you. I thank God He gives us peace. Praise our Lord!

March Mission of the Month: Philippians (Arise Children Bick Miller)

Together with her niece and other family members, Bick Mendoza Miller of Arise Children in Baltic, Ohio has organized a relief distribution for the victims of the Taal Volcano eruption which occurred on Sunday January 12,

2020 in and around her home village (Cavite and Batangas) in the Philippines. Over 70,000 residents were evacuated to temporary shelters in 300 evacuation centers. Thick ash plumes burst from the volcano's crater, bringing ash fall to nearby provinces resulting in people, vegetation, and fields with still planted crops being blanketed in a heavy layer of ash resulting in millions of dollars in damage from the disaster and much sickness. Bick has coordinated with 6 Medical Doctors to give Medical assistance to the victims. In addition to Doctors and medicine, funds are also being used to buy rice, bottled water, and canned goods.

Update as of February 10, 2020: The volcano has quieted down but is still smoking. People within 7 kilometers radius are still not allowed to return to their homes. It is now Mandatory to wear face masks as they are dealing with ashes and Coronavirus. Bick's sister has sent the message that there is a shortage of face masks, so Bick and her sewing group are making masks from T-shirt fabric. (Apparently face mask suppliers are out of stock). She just sent 168 pieces and they are making more. Shipping is expensive, but that is the only way to send them. (They go to her sister to distribute). Funds collected will be used for fabric and shipping.

Please pray for Bick and her family and victims affected by this disaster, and if you feel led to help financially, mark your envelope under "monthly missions". Thank you and God Bless!

The Seder Plate Meaning

The *matzah* bread represents the bread baked without yeast which God commanded the Jews to make on the first Passover night.

A hard-boiled egg represents the festival offering and the circle of life.

The charoset, a mixture of apples, pears, nuts and wine, represents the mortar and brick made by the Jews as slaves in Egypt.

The vegetable, often parsley, represents the initial flourishing of the Israelites during the first years in Egypt.



A piece of roasted meat, often the foreleg of a lamb, represents the lamb that was slain and eaten on Passover, and whose blood was sprinkled on the doors of the Jews' homes so the death angel would "pass over" them.

Passover, which celebrates the exodus of the Jewish people from their bondage in Egypt under Pharaoh, is one of the festivals that grounds Jewish life in history and tradition. You too can celebrate it with your family, friends, and neighbors as the Jewish people have celebrated from before the time of Jesus. The *Haggadah* (the telling), which has changed little over the centuries, is our guide to the *Seder* (the order of the ceremony).

Watch for the Seder sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Come experience the blessing of gathering to celebrate the Passover, just as Jesus the Messiah gathered with His disciples at the Last Supper.

We will also be putting toothbrushes in our pencil bags this year.

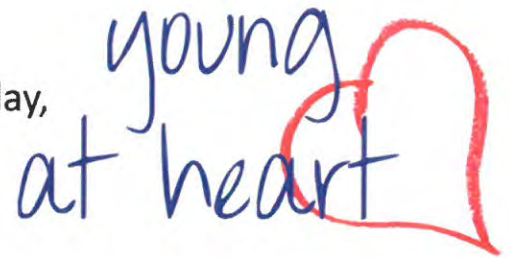
It will soon be time to register for our OCC Mission trip to Charlotte in December. We have 22 spots reserved, contact Becky Roth if you are interested in a registration form.

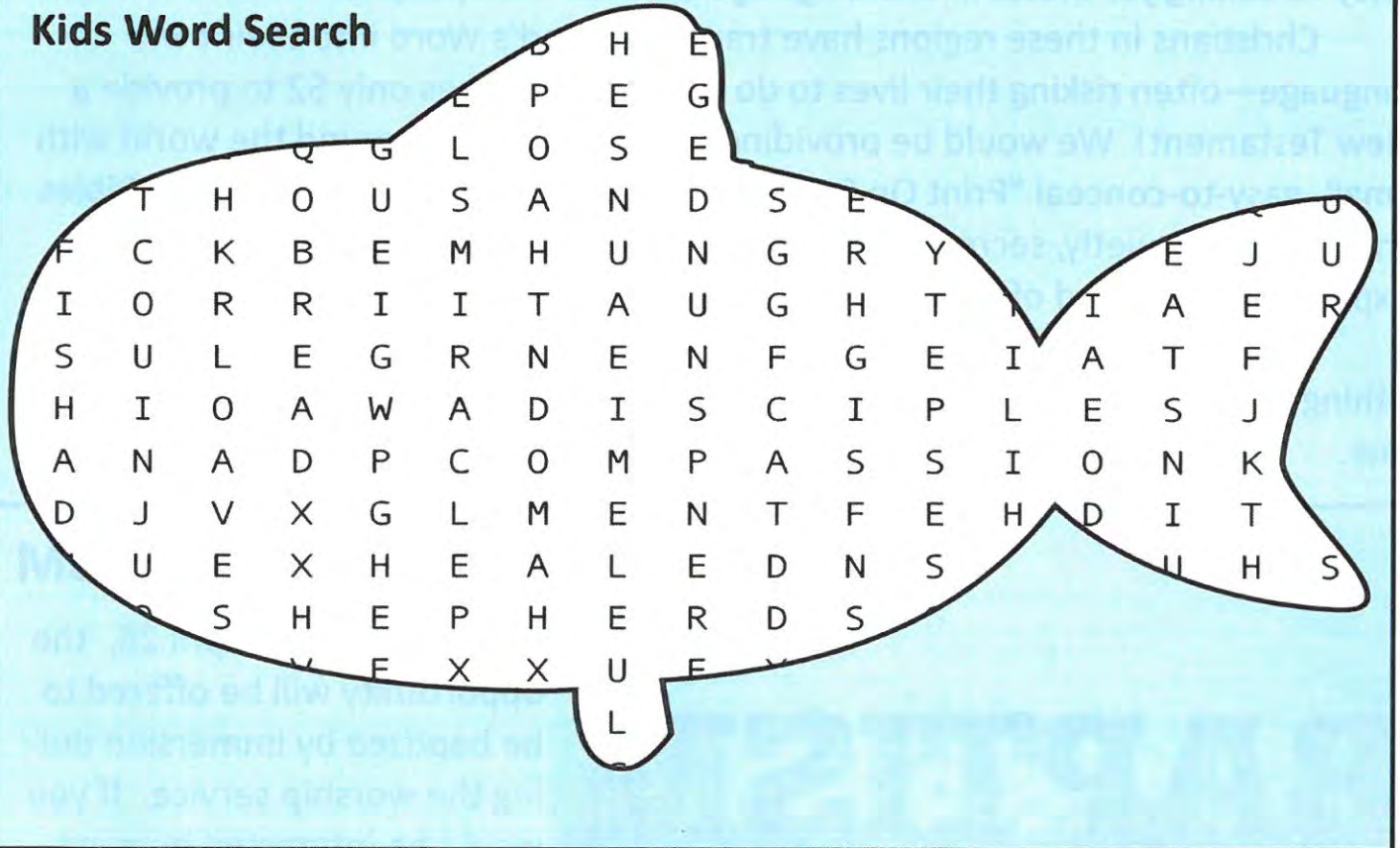

Our current lessons in Sunday School have been discussing “truth” and how it applies in our lives. We tried to answer the very question that Pilate asked Jesus, “What is truth?” Even though Jesus’ answer isn’t recorded, we know the Bible says a lot about truth: *The Gospel is the truth* - Ephesians 1:13, Colossians 1:5; *God wants us to know the truth* - 2 Timothy 2:15; *The Church is meant to protect the truth* - 1 Timothy 3:15; *Some oppose the truth* - 2 Timothy 3:2-8 (With emphasis on verse 7); *The truth should change how we live* - 1 John 3:18. We continued our studies talking about truth in ethics & morality, the truth about ourselves, the truth in media, the truth about being nice, and yet to come are lessons on the truth of self-control money, words, and living the truth.

Our Discipleship nights saw us finish a series on Jesus dwelling in us and we are moving on to a series that we have titled, “Glow” where we discuss a number of topics but it all started with a lesson Jesus being the Light of the world. This study series focuses on darkness & light being metaphors. When we talk about Jesus being light, we're talking about the idea that we're lost and trapped in darkness. We don't know which way we're going or which way we should be going until the light of Christ is there to illumine and inform our lives, our decisions, and our choices. Darkness can hide our sins. It can hide our messiness. Things that we do that are bad and are wrong are the kinds of things that we like to hide in that metaphorical darkness. Thankfully, the light of Jesus gives us the opportunity to truly live the way God wants us to live. The light doesn't just exist to expose and drive out sin but to allow us to fully and truly live God-honoring lives.

I can't wait to go even deeper in this series and see where it takes us. Until next time...

HAITI TRIP UPDATE

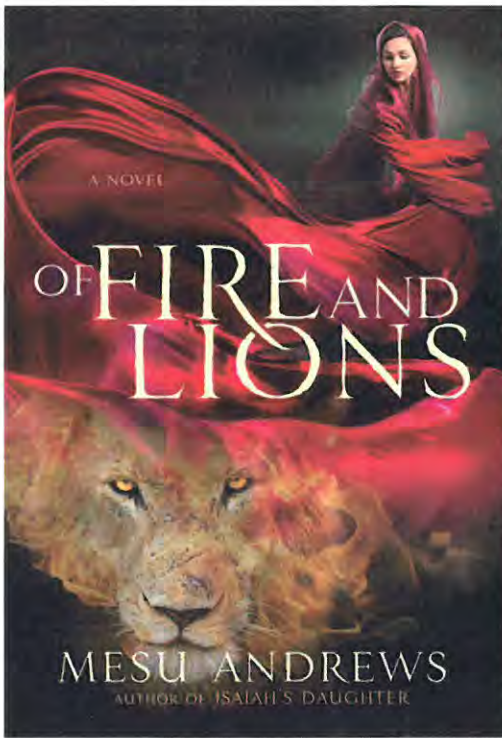
