Traditional service set your alarms, and come ready.



"Start Worrying, Details to Follow."

Amos 9:13-15

"Behold, the days are coming," declares the Lord, "when the plowman shall overtake the reaper and the treader of grapes him who sows the seed; the mountains shall drip sweet wine, and all the hills



shall flow with it. I will restore the fortunes of my people Israel, and they shall rebuild the ruined cities and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and drink their wine, and they shall make gardens and eat their fruit. I will plant them on their land, and they shall never again be uprooted out of the land that I have given them," says the Lord your God.

Sometimes I think we have lost the habit of hope. If thankfulness and praise should be a habit for the Christian, (and it should.) If love and patience should be the default settings for a Christian's heart, (and it should.) If faithfulness is the very barcode on a Christian's soul, (and it is.) Then we also need to have a habit of looking hopefully forward. Look it up: Faith Hope and Love are the "big three" for a Christian. (1 Corinthians 13:13)

Amos concludes his book with words of hope. We shall know a flourishing and abundant life. We shall know God's hand upon the circumstances we experience. We shall rebuild. We shall know the satisfaction of seeing good labors completed. We shall know security. This is all proclaimed even though the people of Amos' time were experiencing great suffering, with more likely to follow. Much of the damage was of their own making. Certainly, except for a few like Amos, Israel's leadership was not life-affirming and effective. But nevertheless, . . . Hope.

I will not try to outline the path we still have to tread through the news. I won't even mention any of the issues. If you follow such things, you are aware. If you do not, suffice it to understand that every day the news is like a noteworthy telegram one Jewish woman sent her sister in New York in the 1950's: "Start worrying, details to follow." Except I would change it to this; "Start Hoping, details to follow."

We have firm grounds to trust in the Lord this autumn, into next year, and to the end of our present life. Beyond that waits the resurrection of the body, the life everlasting, and the new heaven and New Earth. The puzzling question is why aren't we throwing our hats in the air? We should!

Hope should also pervade our personal circumstances. All of us are likely to know the piece of misfortune, the dreaded diagnosis, or the disappointing family member. Even more to the point, we may fail to meet our own best expectations, cause damage, and sow trouble for ourselves. The next morning though, the proper response is to begin again, seize on the Lord's constant compassion and go forward, work and rebuild, in Hope.



Your Witness—"An Easy Guide to 'Care and Share" - by Don Gibson

Have you ever been in a dialogue with someone, or wanted to start a dialogue, and you sensed the Holy Spirit encouraging you to pray or share Jesus? That is likely if our lives are tuned in with God—because we trust Christ and His Word daily. After all, the Bible says about Christians in Romans 6:18 "Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness."

Satan wants Christians to forget that we are God's servants of righteousness. But if we feed ourselves with Spiritual food daily (Holy Scriptures) we stay tuned to where God wants to use us every day. We sense the Holy Spirit leading us to care and share with others.

Here's an easy edited guide I learned at a recent Field of Freedom training session. It's Scriptural for sure, and an opportunity to both care and share Christ.

When talking with another, or you are led to start a conversation, be friendly in talking about anything, especially what's on the other person's mind.

Before ending the conversation, ask if the person has a prayer need, or wants prayer.

Say, "I'm going to pray in the name of Jesus...have you surrendered your heart to Him yet?"

If not, share the Gospel (a brief guide below), then ask <u>again</u>..."Have you surrendered your heart to Jesus yet?"


THEN, pray for the person's needs in the name of Jesus.

Here's a guide to share the Gospel of Christ. In sharing the Gospel, the simpler the better. Use other Scriptures if needed, based on the person's responses/ questions.

- God created man to have a relationship with Him. "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them." Genesis 1:27
- Sin separates people from God. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;" Romans 3:23
- The result of sin is no relationship with God and eternal death. But God provides THE REMEDY. "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 6:23
- God loves every person, and He wants us to believe that Jesus paid our penalty for sin. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16
