On Maundy Thursday, Pastor Harley will lead us in a Seder.

The Passover Meal is celebrated every year by Jewish families, the same meal Jesus had with his disciples, the Last Supper. Passover reminds us that it was God who breathed new life into His people as He rescued them out from under the yoke of the Egyptians. In the Passover, we see God giving the breath of freedom to the promises He made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to make their offspring a vast and innumerable people and eventually, a nation through which all the nations of the earth would be blessed.

The only difference in our Seder is we add how the Hebrews being freed from slavery by God symbolized Jesus and our salvation.

Communion, a unique activity for the youngsters, and a full meal are all a part of the Seder, so don't eat before coming. A sign-up sheet will be available in the Narthex. We will gather at 6:00 PM in casual clothes since this is a family-style meal. Please come to this delightful Easter season celebration.

The lyrics Chris Tomlin added to the old hymn "Amazing Grace" surely strike a chord.

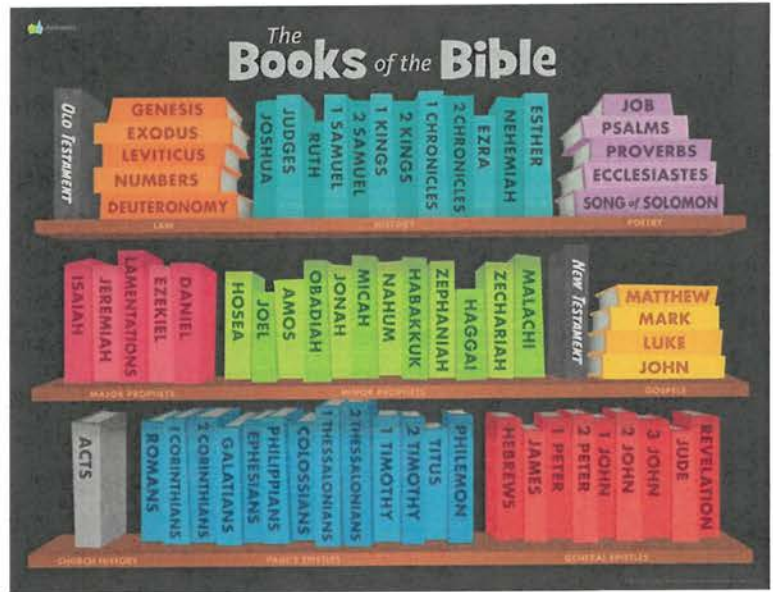

April Mission of the month: Beneath the Shade

(A REFUGE FOR WOMEN IN RECOVERY)



Beneath the Shade is a transitional living space for women who choose recovery and want to rebuild their lives and explore what having a relationship with the Living God is about. Beneath the Shade is for women who have lived with substance use disorders, have at least 30 days substance-free, and know they need more time in a semi-structured and loving setting to live successfully on their own. The

length of the program is fourteen to eighteen months, depending on a woman's need and growth. They have three women admitted into the program at this time.

The ministry is located just outside Dover on 14 beautiful acres, on which sits a house and a barn. The house will be home to six women, five participants, and a full-time house manager and staff. The barn will be remodeled and developed as a meeting, classroom, and art studio space for both program participants and the community at large as appropriate.

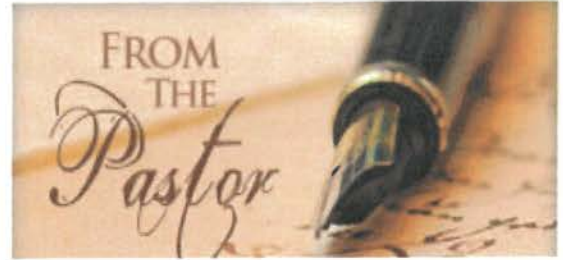
Their mission is to cultivate a nurturing interim living space for women with substance use disorders, supporting the hard work of learning to love God, self, neighbor, and creation.

They are committed to cultivating a transformational space that recognizes gratitude, resilience, vulnerability, joy (laughter, silliness, play), creativity, and meaningful work (both voluntary and work as a means to make a living) are essential.

When I Fall, I Shall Rise

Micah 7:8 “Rejoice not over me, my enemy. When I fall, I shall rise. When I sit in darkness, the Lord will be a light to me.”



When we gather on Easter morning, we will surely sing Hallelujah. Hallelujah is a word the church owns, it really doesn't have a place in our modern, everyday culture, where it seems there are always more products and more diversions, but steadily less reasons for Joy. Songs with Hallelujah are songs of Christian faith and are not written and are not sung in the rather depressing and negative social movements of our day, and I have not seen any of the social media influencers with Hallelujah in their lips, or in their news feeds.

So the world may wonder, and should wonder, why do we sing our loudest Hallelujahs only days after remembering a death?

Resurrection is the reason. Death is an enemy. It is true that family love and a grace-filled life can ease the terrors of death. Advancing weakness in the body, and pain, can sometimes make the end of this mortal life a welcome thing. But we are not born to make creation our grave. We are born to live in His eternal Kingdom, and to be residents of the New Heaven and New Earth that advances ever closer. God has made His promise. Jesus said “I go to prepare a place for you, and I will come again, and take you to myself, that where I am you may be also.” (John 14:3) Jesus rose from death, and will bring us into the kingdom with Him, and His resurrection power is at work in His church even now.

I pray you have joy when we sing Hallelujah. But I am not asking for an emotion only. (Even the best Easter Sunday may leave some without an emotional pick-me-up.) Look at Micah's words, don't they seem a bit, well, defiant? “Rejoice not over me, my enemy.” I recommend a Hallelujah that is sung despite the powers of darkness and death. When you confess, “If I fall, I will rise.” this statement ought to be spoken to the face of the enemy. You can do this regardless of 'mood.' It is not fed by feeling, but by a decision to faithful conviction and commitment. The enemy seeks to “steal, kill, and destroy”, (John 10:10) but he will lose every soul that is held in Jesus' hand. Victory awaits the saved, and we have the prophet's example, and the testimony of the empty tomb that we may make a defiant Hallelujah. We will not be defeated. Darkness we may have, also low times and bitter grief, but we shall **Rise**.

February 10, 2022, was an exciting day for Danielle & Darren Rowland and their family because — after two years of hard work — they finally got the keys to their new house, built by Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio.

Now that they have their own home, Devon is looking forward to getting a dog and a swing in the backyard.

"We're very grateful for the help people have given us," Danielle said.

Habitat homeowners help build their own homes alongside volunteers and purchase them with an affordable zero-interest mortgage. Danielle and Darren even worked at the house on the day before their wedding.

Courtney Brown, director of family and faith partnership with Habitat, had worked with Danielle for two years to make this day possible.

"The house is something that we're a part of, but this family is going to make it a home,"



Brown said. "That makes us so happy that we could put up the walls and we can secure the loan, but it's Danielle and Darren and their whole extended family that is going to make this place a home."

Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio serves Stark, Carroll, Tuscarawas, Harrison, and Jefferson counties. It has built 16 new houses and preserved two homes in Tuscarawas County.

Your Witness—“Further Than We Think” - by Don Gibson

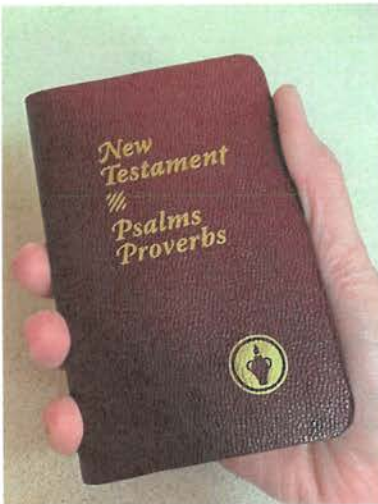

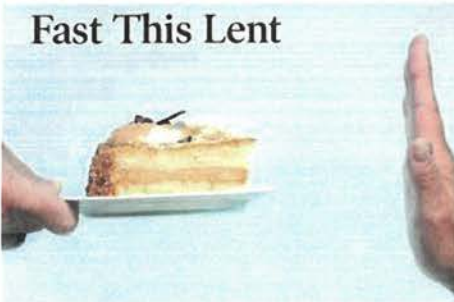
Dear Broadway Church Family,

Fast This Lent



The Lenten Fast

Each year, many Christians practice a time of self-denial through Lent, the period between Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, this year) and Easter Sunday. Traditionally, one could fast from a favorite food, or a regular habit. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, practiced a fast day by abstaining from all food between supper one evening to supper the next. If one is healthy, you will come to no harm by doing this. In fact, many good things may happen. You will be reminded that life is not all about satisfying a desire, that many people are hungry in just such a way, but not by choice, and you will be reminded to pray, when you notice the hunger and for a moment cannot remember why. A fast does not make you a hero, our more worthy of praise, but it can deepen your walk with Jesus.

In Christian tradition, Sundays are actually 'little Easters' where abstaining is not required, although most people refrain from, say, chocolate or soda pop, every day through Easter, it just seems more consistent.

Alternatively, you may want to consider a News or Social Media fast. We have a 24-hour exposure to images and messages, which frankly, most of us do not need. Consider that a three-minute check will be enough to let you know who had a birthday if any wars have started. The Tweets and posts will go on without you. Usually, you will find that little has changed from one month to the next. This can clear your mind and your day to consider what is actually going on, away from a screen.

Lastly, remember that the Lenten Fast has the effect of giving us a pivot for spiritual conversation. One does not boast about a fast, or try to outdo others, but the world is fascinated, and Christians are encouraged, to know that something about your walk with God actually has an impact on your material life. This is true of every faithful Christian, but the fast is a useful symbol of this constant interaction with God.

Snowdrops

Matthew 6:28 “Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow. . . .”

Some years back a friend encouraged me to literally consider the ‘lilies of the field.’ She was a trained naturalist, and pointed out that the early flowers in a forest, that bloom before the canopy leaves come in, are both unique and very short-lived. You have to intentionally look for them, because soon the advancing spring will favor other plants.

I took this advice to heart, and scanned alongside the trail for the early flowers. Two years ago I found these beautiful white flowers, dainty and fragile. Quite a reward for seeking them, because I likely wouldn’t have noticed them otherwise.

What can we learn from this? Well, first, that we may as well consider Jesus’ words to be a command, and not merely advice. I am sure we are better people when we consider growing things, than we are if we do not. Jesus chooses both large and small ways to grow our souls. It is worth pointing out that we say we will ‘live for Him,’ a very large task, but we easily neglect the small task of rejoicing in flowers for His sake. Think about it; if we are not faithful with the little things, will we prove to be faithful in the large?



Second, I had to ask what these flowers were. This is easy and fun; take a picture with your phone and post it online asking who knows the right name. I got three responses right away. We need to learn to ask. There are people who can be guides on our walk to heaven. They know the ‘right names’ of what we encounter; sin, affliction, blessing, etc. Help is closer than we think. Jesus is our Shepherd, but He delights to see us help each other.
