

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER 2022

May 5, 2022 EXALT THE LORD WHO HAS ESTABLISHED US

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation.

Every year, local, state, and federal observances were held from sunrise in Maine to sunset in Hawaii, uniting Americans from all socio-economic, political and ethnic backgrounds in prayer for our nation. It is estimated that over two million people attended more than 30,000 observances – organized by approximately 40,000 volunteers. People stopped their activities and gathered for prayer at state capitols, county courthouses, on the steps of city halls, and in schools, businesses, churches, and homes.


The National Day of Prayer belongs to all Americans. It is a day that transcends differences, bringing together citizens from all backgrounds. Mrs. Shirley Dobson, NDP chairman emeritus, reminded us: "We have lost many of our freedoms in America because we have been asleep. I feel if we do not become involved and support the annual National Day of Prayer, we could end up forfeiting this freedom, too."

Feed My Sheep

John 21:17" He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."



This verse, from the end of the Gospel of John, is part of a question-and-answer between Jesus and Peter. It seems that Peter, the most famous unfaithful friend in the world, who denied Jesus three times, is given a chance to affirm his love for Jesus three times.

We rejoice to see this. We all have grief over the many times we have failed to answer Jesus when He called, act when He wanted us to act, or stand firm when he commanded us to be steadfast. We need to know that Christ will not give up on us. Like Peter, we love the Lord, we are full of the good news that He is Risen, and we want to respond. But our hearts darken if we begin to doubt that He will patiently bear with our flaws.

The patience of God is a searching patience, though. He tries and tests our hearts, so we can know ourselves better. When we are called back, it is not like an instance when we have offended in some small way, and the other chooses to overlook some minor slight. God takes our failure in faith seriously. After all, none can be saved without faith. But the road back is plain: confess your belief along with your faults, and meet the One who forgave the most famous unfaithful friend in the world.

God also does not, after we return, settle down and leave us alone. Peter, already set aside to lead, is told to go, to lead, and to 'feed my sheep.' Peter will know people as shaky and undependable as he was. People who follow the crowd and not the Master, and people who are intent on the material world before them, and need called again and again. In other words, he will meet people who are very much like sheep. Timid, skittish, prone to herding together, and focused on the daily feed. They must be trained even to attend the shepherds call.

So Peter's experience means we have work to do. But it is likely to be patient work, because God is patient, or compassionate work, because God is compassionate, or prophetic work, because He calls and challenges his people.

God has work for you today!

May Mission of the month: Christian Children's Home of Ohio

We will have guest speaker Dan Franks from the Christian Children's Home of Ohio on May 1st, at both services and Sunday school. You will not want to miss this special Sunday.

The Christian Children's Home of Ohio (CCHO) is a local nonprofit organization that has provided

opportunities for donors to help abused and neglected children for more than 50 years. Based in Wooster, Ohio and serving all of Ohio— including Wayne County, Summit County, Stark County, Cuyahoga County, Franklin County, *Tuscarawas County*, and the surrounding areas—CCHO is a safe place for kids who have suffered extreme forms of physical abuse, sexual abuse, and emotional abuse, as well as survivors of sex trafficking. Initially licensed as a foster care/group home for children, CCHO now has five cottages on its campus that are home to as many as *46 kids*, *ages 6-17*, who have often been abused by parents or other people they trust.


This faith-based charity in Ohio helps children learn the tools they need to overcome the trauma they've experienced through various forms of therapeutic approaches (including recreational therapy, art therapy, and equine therapy) as well as social, spiritual, and educational opportunities designed to aid the child with the healing process, a model for them on how a healthy family functions, develop coping and life skills, and introduce them to Jesus Christ.

CCHO exists to help people experience their worth in Christ. Parents and families also have access to counseling and home-based services with the ultimate goal of reuniting children with their families whenever possible. CCHO's professional programs and services are open to individuals and families.

With support from dozens of churches, community organizations, and a host of caring individuals, along with the hard work of more than 150 employees and oversight from their Board of Trustees, CCHO exists to help people experience their worth in Christ as a licensed Child Care Agency by the Ohio Department of Human Services. They are grateful and humbled by the work God has done through CCHO and can't wait to see what He does over the next 50 years!

God's promise to the brokenhearted is clear and encouraging: "I will give them one heart, and a new spirit I will put within them. I will remove the heart of stone from their flesh and give them a heart of flesh." Time and again, they've watched God move in miraculous ways to change the bruised and battered hearts of boys and girls who have never heard that they are loved unconditionally. They come in crisis, in pain, in need, and find safety, healing and peace.





Psalm 116:1-2 I love the Lord, because He hears my voice and my pleadings. Because He has inclined His ear to me, therefore I shall call upon Him as long as I live.

My daughter-in-law and her husband are good dog people. They keep very well-behaved, very <u>large</u> dogs. I admire this, because I am not that kind of person. I have struggled to keep my past dog friends from helping themselves to food from the counter, or from bellowing at every person who passed by the window. But



Rachel's dogs never steal food, are admirably well-behaved, and are quiet when asked to be quiet.

Spoiled is a word for the less-trained dog. One must be firm, and not give in to pleading looks and whining. The dog mostly wants to be with you, so loving discipline eventually brings the dog to a place of perfect, (for a dog) contentment.

What are we to make of the Lord, though? He always hears our pleadings. The Lord bends to listen when we call. Are we not likely to be spoiled by all his love and attention?

The love God has for us takes the risk of giving us such wonderful blessings that we may become distracted from seeking Him alone. He can manage this. But we must be intentional about moving ever closer to Him in prayer, even as we naturally ask Him for our daily needs.

Try to be half as faithful as your dog, trust the Master, and you'll see a difference!

Your Witness—Now In Ukraine" - by Don Gibson

In this regularly running article in Broadway's newsletter, I am compelled this edition to provide you an update not likely in the news media. We have a witnessing opportunity. It's happening now in Ukraine. Broadway's March mission-of-the-month provided over \$2,300 for Scriptures. That money is now funding Scriptures that will be distributed here in Tuscarawas County, Ohio, and countries abroad. Thank you, Broadway. The Gideons International has allocated emergency funding of additional copies currently being distributed to Ukrainian refugees in Ukraine, Romania, Hungary, Poland, and even in Russia. Gideons are our missionaries who live and serve in 200 countries. Gideons number 2,100 in Ukraine and 3,300 in Russia, plus those in adjacent countries.

Here's our witness from one Gideon family in Ukraine. (Remember, Broadway is praying and providing Scriptures for this). From Romania: "For years we witnessed to our neighbors and invited them to church. They are in the flower business and always said they were too busy. But now people are thinking about what awaits them in eternity. Our neighbors and relatives knelt down crying, asking God for forgiveness. The daughter of our neighbor wept and regretted she had not come to God for years. Tears of repentance flowed down her cheeks. The heaviness fell from her heart and relief came for her. Our refugee guests and neighbors received Scriptures from The Gideons—the saving good news of Jesus Christ. Our neighbors told us they did not part with their Scriptures even at night. Today is the 47th day of the war and we are still together. We're grateful to God that we are still alive and blessed by Him."

Please pray. It's yours and my witness in Ukraine to millions. Pray transporting Scriptures to refugees can continue. Pray people turn to God for salvation, for renewed salvation, for hope, for deeper trust relationships with Christ. From God's perspective, we're all in this together. Thank you, Broadway.

June Mission of the Month: Mark and Eszti Landerholm

Mark and Eszti Landerholm are a new mission for Broadway Church. We are excited to introduce the church to them. Mark will be speaking at Broadway on June 5th at both services. Here is a little about Mark and Eszti and their mission.



Although they grew up on two different continents, their stories are similar in many ways: they are both from wonderful Christ-centered families, both accepted Jesus as their personal Savior at a very young age, and Jesus called both of them to serve as missionaries.

As a small child, Eszti started accompanying her parents on missions trips in Hungary and Ukraine. During high school, Jesus placed children's ministries—specifically orphans—on her heart. After graduating from college, Mark served in Uganda, Kenya, South Sudan, and Ukraine for 11 months as a volunteer with World Global Missions. During this time, Jesus more fully put Europe on his heart. Following seminary graduation in 2010, he led a group of college students on a short-term missions trip to Hungary. This is where he met Eszti, who was helping with English Camp.

After returning to the States - Mark to Kentucky for work and Eszti to Tennessee to finish college—they kept in touch and eventually fell in love. The following summer, Eszti went home, and Mark visited her and her family and did some missions work together. Mark was sure about two things: first, He wanted to marry Eszti; second, He knew that Jesus had called him to serve in Hungary. They got engaged, and as they were praying together for Jesus' guidance, God placed Hungary on Eszti's heart. Their great desire is to see Jesus made real in people's lives. Then, as they live in obedience to Jesus that their lives will bring about the kingdom of God in their families and communities.

Upper rooms cost the church \$1.25 each.








