Our God is so good to us at Broadway! We are excited to announce we are no longer a member of the United Methodist Church! We have decided to part ways and have joined the Global Methodist Church effective July 1, 2022.

The biggest changes are

- 1. There will be unity around the authority of Scripture.
- 2. The church will be truly global. As theological conservatives transition to the Global Methodist Church within five years, most of its local churches are likely to be located in Africa.
- 3. There will be no trust clause in the Global Methodist Church. We will own all our property and assets rather than hold them in trust for the general church.

4. We will no longer have a large bureaucratic structure with numerous boards and agencies seeking funding from annual conferences and the local churches representing them.

What does it mean for us? We are being obedient to Our Father.

What does He have in store for the Global Methodist Church and Broadway? The Holy Spirit will no longer be hindered so get ready for the blessing coming!
Our God is so good!





Our Vision is to join God in a journey of bringing new life, reconciliation, and the presence of Christ to all people, and to helping each person to increasingly reflect the character of Christ.

Through our ministries, we desire to share the whole counsel of God with all peoples and to advance the presence and fulfillment of the Kingdom of God in every part of the world and at all levels of societies and cultures. The Global Methodist Church is committed to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, the inspiration and authority of the Scriptures, and the work of the Holy Spirit in conveying God's truth and grace to all people.

We will be a global church that recognizes and deploys the gifts and contributions of each part of the church, working as partners in the gospel with equal voice and leadership.

About Our Name & Logo

THE NAME

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, proclaimed, "The world is my parish." Ever since, the people called Methodist have committed to sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with people all around the world.

In that spirit, faithful Methodists have been praying and working to discern God's will for a new church rooted in Scripture and the historic and life giving teachings of the Christian faith. Given that those called to this new denomination are from many countries, speak many languages, and yet share one faith, the name "the Global Methodist Church" seemed fully appropriate.

Methodists in Africa, Europe, Eurasia, the Philippines, and the United States have warmly embraced the name. It simultaneously states who we are and who we aspire to be: faithful Christians in the Methodist tradition dedicated to sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with people all around the world.

THE LOGO

The Global Methodist Church's logo brings together in its three circles the one God – the Father, the Son, and the Spirit – who alone we worship. The circles intersect at the center of the cross of Jesus Christ, the symbol of our deliverance from our slavery to sin and fear of death. The outer circumference of the rings represents the globe. As a whole, the logo communicates God's sending of the church into the world. The sky blue color reminds us that even though Global Methodists live all around the world, they are all united together in God's great creation.

Back in the Family

Acts 2:42-43

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles."



If you imagine attending the church described here in Acts, do you picture gliding serenely through the doorway, with your hands folded in prayer and your eyes uplifted? I am not saying you are wrong. But I would suggest that it was also pretty fun and exciting to be among the first believers! Think about it:

Devoted to The Teaching: It's not just that they thought the Gospel was true. They did indeed. But we know a lot of things are true that we do not feel devoted toward. They had seen the Gospel change lives. Many of them had seen the Risen Lord. They knew the indwelling Holy Spirit, and all His Gifts. Of course they were devoted to the teaching. It was a community with a common passion.

Fellowship: It is something to be among people who are excited about the same thing. They would be the extended family to the nth power. To the children, all the men would be kindly uncles and all the women, loving aunts. It was a place of safety and welcome.

Breaking of Bread: Not just to eat, but to talk. To be in the same place and know that each day there is a fresh blessing of provision. And it comes through the hands of the baker, the butcher, and the homemaker, who are all part of the big Christian family.

Prayer: Imagine being able to ask anyone, anyone in the circle, to pray for a need. Imagine that people were easily seeing the hand of God in the events and thanking Him.

Awe and Wonders and Signs: Things made you say "Wow", (Wonders) Things happened in people's lives that pointed right at Jesus, (Signs). If you missed a church meeting, you missed a lot!

I really do. Most of us, when we read these verses in Acts, rightly allow ourselves to think about the true nature and purpose of the church. This isn't just information about how the first disciples ate and what they did. We strongly and rightly feel that this is what church is supposed to be. We want to see ourselves reach something like the excellence of our forebears, rather than become a generation degraded like no other before it. When I read this, I think our church must seek to be more like that.

With our joining the Global Methodist Church, we are taking just such a step, and it promises to be pretty exciting!

Separating from the United Methodist denomination is not us sadly tearing something apart. Our church is seeking to heal our wound, and recover our joy. We could see that the UMC had lost its secure mooring in scripture, in the moral teaching of the universal church, and did not gladly affirm the Apostles creed faith. It was a grief to be separated from the church of the Apostles, (That worships around His Throne Today!) It was a sad distraction to be wondering what stale old heresy would be trumpeted as the next big thing from our leadership. It was the UMC that was leaving, by stages, the true family of believers. We have returned to that family by our joining with the Global Methodist Church. We share again in the worldwide, and eternal community of faith. We are ready for the signs and wonders. We are ready to sit with the faithful on Earth, and in Heaven, and we are passionate about all that the Gospel means in our lives.

God's Perfect recipe

As you create your recipe, talk about how God created each of us just the way he wanted us. He put all our parts together just like we're putting these ingredients together. We are God's perfect recipe!

Your Witness—The Exceeding Greatness of His Power — by Don Gibson

I noticed in a parking lot the other day a pretty beefy pick-up truck. Wow! It just screamed power. The phrase on the side of it described as super duty or something that implied it was a serious vehicle. It was surely a 4x4. Maybe even a 6x6 or 7x7. I'm thinking...what power... that truck could pull a house!

So I wonder how much of God's power we Christians reveal in our day-to-day lives. Do we look like God is working in us—revealing himself in us? Or does it appear we are running on our own power? What does God say about that in His Word?

Ephesians 1:16 "Cease not to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers; **17** That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him:

18 The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,

19 And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to usward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power,"

I'm looking at V19. "What is the exceeding greatness of his power toward us?" God extends his power toward us? Is there a condition? Sure is! The verse says it works in people who believe. And it says it's according to the working of God's power. No, wait. God's mighty power. So if we apply that to a pickup truck, it might have a thousand horsepower. But because the Word calls God the "Almighty," believers-in-Christ who walk in the Spirit have God Almighty working in us at unlimited horsepower. Wow! And sometimes we think God can't handle an issue we're experiencing.

Notice in verse 18 God tells us the eyes of our understanding is enlightened. I love that language..."the eyes of our understanding". V18 even tells us why God does that. It says that we might know the hope of his calling, and the riches of his glory in the saints. That's us. Imagine that. God is revealing all this to us in a mightier way than that pickup truck reveals its power. It's God's witness to us about himself!

I suppose the true test of the truck's power is to go drive it in rough and challenging driving conditions. The manufacturer would want us to put it to the test on rough terrain. That way we could really experience power. And observers would see the mighty truck power the manufacturer built into it. Maybe that's why God blesses Christians with rough terrain in life—to show his power! It's our witness of God in us. Now I'm going to read those verses above again.

Broadway's Mission Offerings and Prayers at Work Gideon News - Ukraine SURROUNDING COUNTRIES ASSISTING REFUGEES

May 20, 2022 | By Gideon Staff, Nashville, Tennessee

The war in Ukraine has led to much anxiety in neighboring and other European countries like Poland, the Baltic states, Finland, and Norway. Thousands of refugees have arrived in reception centers in many countries, where Gideons and Auxiliary continue distributing Scriptures and encouraging people with the hope of God's Word.

The national association executive director in Finland states, "The refugees, who are mostly women and children, have found their way to Finnish churches where Gideons and Auxiliary are engaging with them and providing Ukrainian New Testaments." Finland expects to receive some 80,000 refugees by the end of this year.

Germany is also feeling the impact as demands for Scriptures have drastically increased. Gideons and Auxiliary are sharing Ukrainian, Russian, and Romanian Testaments as they are able. "In times of supply shortages and logistics problems, we feel how much we depend on prayer and God's help. He does not abandon His children, and we have been able to experience that especially in the last few weeks," says the executive director for The Gideons in Germany.

Please continue praying for peace in Ukraine and Russia, and **pray that many refugees find true peace and hope in Christ** through God's Holy Word. **Broadway's member Gideons** and The Tuscarawas County Camp of The Gideons International thank Broadway for your prayers and gifts. It's working every day in Eastern Europe, as well as here locally.




