Worship in the Park

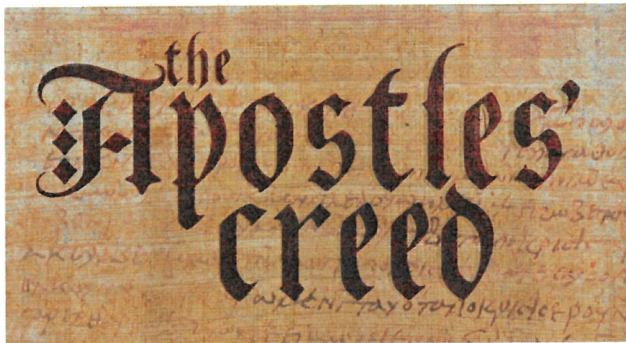
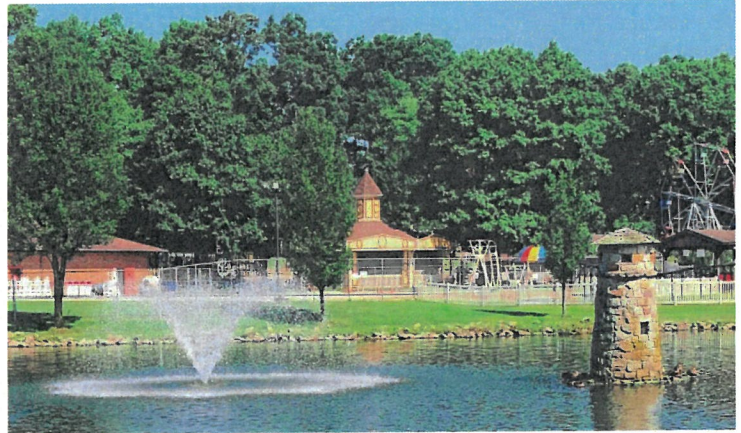
Sunday, September 11th

Our church wide packing party will be held November 3rd, we will have a light dinner at 5pm and start packing approximately at 6 pm.

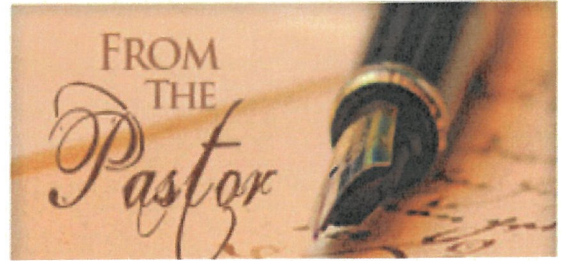
Mission Trip to Process Shoeboxes in Charlotte!

A Body of Works and a Living Faith

James 2:14-17

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.



This passage is a command to add good works to your life of faith. James took seriously Jeremiah 29:7 *"But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, . . ."* As a people waiting for the New Heaven and New Earth, we, even if we are exiles here and citizens of heaven, are to seek the good of the community we live in.

All this is right and true, and very, very clear. (Reading James makes you wonder about people who say the Bible is hard to understand!) Who can miss the dark humor in a person wishing warm clothing and good food to a needy person, and yet doing nothing at all to help?

There is a second way to live this verse. It helps the fulfillment of the command. Ask yourself, what is God doing in all this? He is not simply commanding 'works' from a people saved by grace and keeping critical notes on His ledger. He desires us to be alive and not dead.

If Faith without works is dead, His will is that we be alive and not dead. He is invested in seeing Jesus' love made real in us. He will assist us to add his works to our lives.

The passage lifts up a hungry, poorly clothed person, and makes it clear that something must be done. Now, ask yourself; Are not works of love and mercy the food and clothing of the saints? Consider:

John 4:34 "Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work."

Revelation 19:8 "It was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"— for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints."

God wants us to be fed by good works. He desires us to be clothed with the fine linen of righteous deeds. God will not pass by, or deliver a spiritual blessing only, when he sees us lacking the food and clothing of good works. God will act to supply us with opportunity, with strength, and with the desire to minister in His name. He will fulfill Jesus' words about the church:

John 14:12 "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father."

So we are to be looking for these opportunities, and praying for them earnestly. We should trust that they will come just as we trust God to provide all good things. We have been saved to be light and mercy to a hurting world. As Paul wrote in Ephesians 2:10; *"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."*

Your Witness—As a Sufferer, a Prayer Warrior, a Victor — by Don Gibson

Yesterday was Sunday School. What happened there, among believers? Our witness—yes, our witness to each other as believers in Christ. **Represented there were Christians suffering or reporting others suffering a wide array of issues.** Health issues are usually the most common. But job situations, opportunity issues, relationship issues and more. Often, the issues are present with class members. Additionally, every Sunday, class members bring to the rest of us prayer requests for others—not just our own. **That my fellow believers, is our witness.** It reveals that we Christians are aware of others' needs and not only want to pray for others, but to ask others to pray. It also witnesses to all of us that we ourselves suffer need for prayers and are willing to ask.

So here are observations and comments and Scriptures about Christians who witness their needs and needs of others. Here's **Philippians 4:11-13**:

[11] Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content.

[12] I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

[13] I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

In Paul's letter to the church, he explains his suffering. **His main point? He knows how to suffer.** And in V13 he tells us what he's learned. **"I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."** Our lesson from God? **Paul's witness is to teach us to develop our own witness of turning to supernatural strength in the person of Jesus Christ.** That way, we are seen as people who acknowledge issues and that we are too weak to walk solo. Whether our witness about issues is for ourselves or others, the center of our witness is counting on Christ for strength. Remember what Paul said in **2 Corinthians 12:10**, **"...for Christ's sake: when I am weak, then I am strong."**

About our own suffering - To recognize that God calls us to call on Him, and then have us **perceive it as an opportunity** for God to work in us, and reveal Himself in us, is our Christian witness. In short, others might think, "There's someone who trusts God." And there is our prayer—that we call on God in everything so we experience life in Christ's strength., not our own. Let's witness Christ's peace, too. It's part of the package. See John 14:27. "...peace I give unto you..."

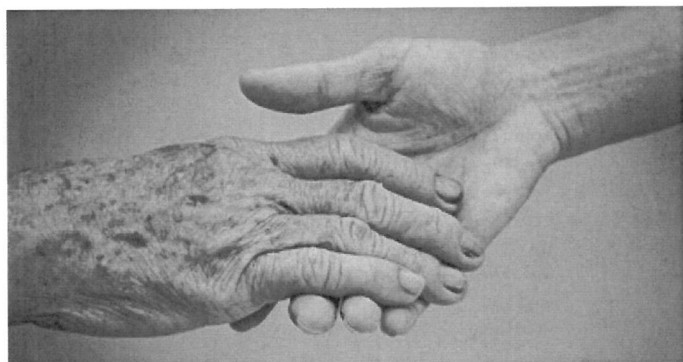
