The OCC packing party is Thursday, Nov. 3rd. A light dinner begins at 5:00 PM, and after, we will start packing. Each shoebox

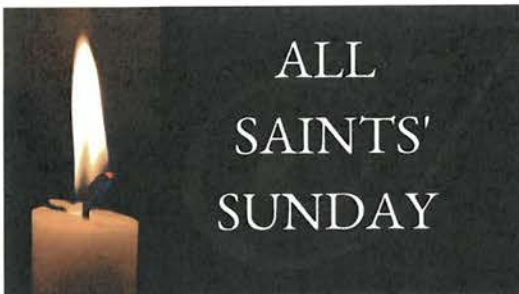

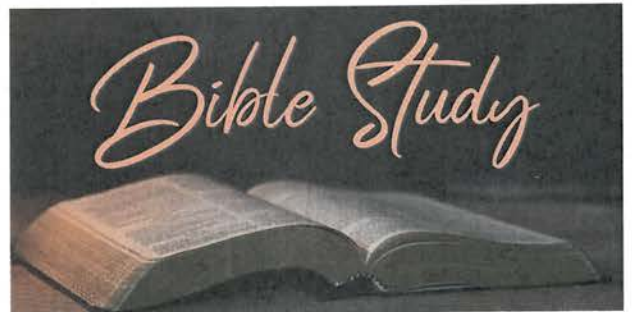


Church Council Meeting

Thanksgiving and Christmas Bible Study Schedule

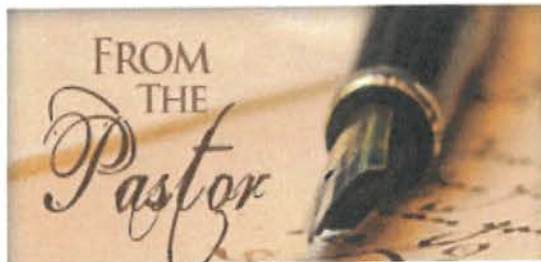
We will not have Bible study Tuesday, November 22nd, or Wednesday, November 23rd, the week of Thanksgiving. Have a Blessed Thanksgiving!

The Children's Residential Center provides a safe, structured environment to meet the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs of children from all across Ohio who have been abused, neglected, and traumatized by those they should be able to trust most. Children ages 6-18 live in spacious cottages and are provided with therapeutic, social, spiritual, and educational opportunities designed to aid the child with the healing process, model for them how a healthy family functions, develop coping and life skills, and introduce them to Jesus Christ.

The Thanksgiving Mission would provide funds to purchase Christmas gifts for the children. CCHO will send us a list of presents the children desire, and we will purchase items with this fund. We have said we would purchase gifts for two boys, two girls, and one for a child who may be placed in the home right before Christmas.

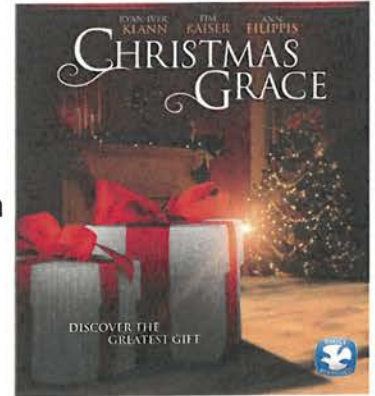

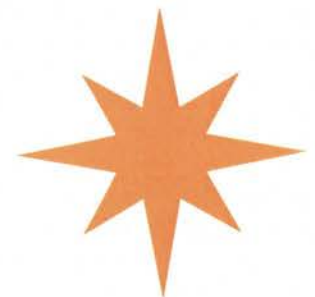

Your Witness— Hurricane Ian Testimony — by Don Gibson

This salvation testimony was written by a Gideon who served at a food bank.

I left West Palm Beach on Saturday morning, stopping in Belle Glade to pick up 700 Gideon Testaments, and headed to Cape Coral for a food distribution at a church. I filled my bag with Testaments and App Cards and made my way to the traffic line to begin handing out Testaments. A man with a hat and sunglasses called out to me and said, "Hey, Bible man, move down a little so we can keep the traffic moving." That man was the pastor of the church. He was happy I was there giving out Scriptures. I told him I would help him direct traffic to keep it moving as I handed out the Testaments. He was very thankful as **they were overwhelmed with the number of cars coming through** and not enough people to work traffic.

About 100 Testaments later, I gave one to a young man, and the Holy Spirit prompted me to point out to him there had been a car accident on the main road earlier in the day right in front of the church. I then asked him if he died today would he go to Heaven or Hell? He replied, "I don't know." I showed him the last two pages of the Testament and then explained about Jesus and the two thieves on the cross. I saw in his eyes that he was convicted, and I had his attention.

Then I asked him his name, and he told me it was Joshua. I said to him, "That name is in the Bible." He replied, "I know, My grandfather named me after Joshua in the Bible." I asked Joshua if he was ready to accept the Lord as his Savior. He replied, "Yes!" I then led him through a prayer asking for forgiveness and salvation, and he repeated every word after me and received Jesus as his Savior.

At about that same time, the pastor walked up to us. I introduced Joshua and told him Joshua had just given his heart to Jesus. The pastor said, "Praise the Lord! Welcome to the family of God!" The pastor spent the next few minutes offering words of encouragement and invited Joshua to attend one of their two church services the next day. I also encouraged him to begin attending church and told him that I would be praying for him.

Our witness: This Gideon could have been any of us who God led to share Christ with another. **Someone needed Christ. Another was ready. God used circumstances**—Hurricane Ian to bring these two men together. Being ready is our witness for Christ. *"But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always..."* 1 Peter 3:15. Who will God lead you and I to—to share Christ—to meet a need?

I knew in a moment it must be THE DAY.

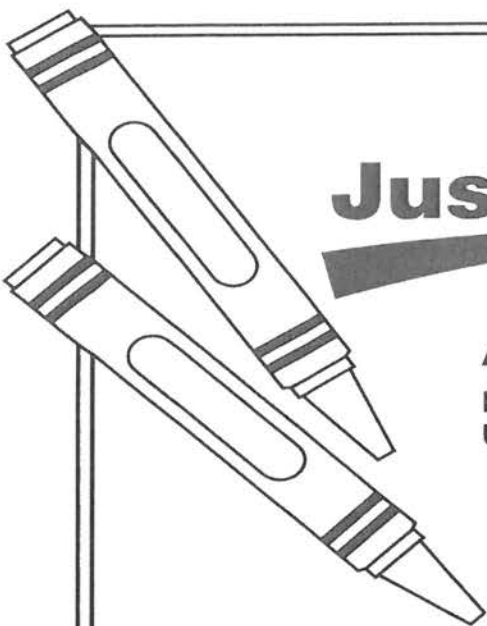
The light of his face made me turn my head,

Oh, if only I had been ready tonight

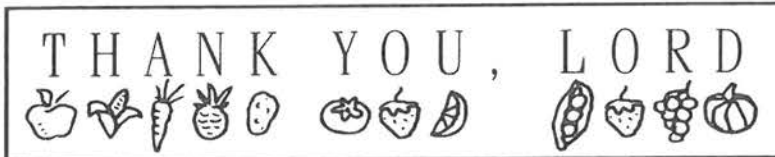
In reading this poem, the meaning is clear.
