obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area. Red Bird Mission and Clinic strives to meet these needs through ministry in five areas: Education, Health and Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement.

Red Bird Christian School serves students in grades PreK-12 and centers on developing the full potential of its students in a Christian atmosphere. Red Bird Christian School provides quality education to students of the Red Bird area regardless of their ability to pay. Enrichment classes in physical education, foreign language, music, and libraries are available to all students. Christian education is incorporated in the curriculum for all grades. Students may graduate from the School with a general, college preparatory, or academic diploma. Many extracurricular activities are available to enhance each student's school experience in academics, humanities, and athletics.

God's New Beginnings

John 1:14 "And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of Grace and Truth."



After the celebration of Christmas, we have seen the Manger displays, heard the Christmas Story, and sung the carols. What then? Of course, we are willing enough to wish people a Happy New Year, but we wonder if a calendar date can really make any difference. Is it reasonable to expect new beginnings in the next year of life?

I can assure you that God is a fan of new beginnings. In the first chapter of John, the first verses tell us of what has always been; The Word was (always) in the beginning, The Word (always) was with God, the Word (always) was God. This emphasis on what *always* has been is clear when the verses are read in the original (Greek) language. But then, in verse 14, where it says the Word 'became flesh', the Greek is clear that something new and sharp and startling has happened. The Son was not always clothed in a body. He acted decisively to begin a redeeming ministry as the man Jesus, fully human and fully God. It was not so before, but he became incarnate, one of us, to work a new salvation for His people.

So God began His saving work in Christ as a new beginning. That is why the first chapter of John reminds us so strongly of the first chapter of Genesis. It tells of a sudden beginning. Light and life burst forth upon a darkened, dying world.

So I believe that we are also moved along by a series of new beginnings. We respond to the gospel message and it is a new birth. We have works of love laid on our heart to do, and it is a new beginning of ministry. God calls us to new opportunities to serve Him. When we are discouraged, new hope arises, and we take heart. The Bible is big on response, God moves, reveals and encounters, and new beginnings happen in our lives.

Even the custom of New Year's resolutions has borne fruit for God. I have seen people renew their walk, take more seriously their call to holiness, and begin again to hear the word preached and worship. I have seen these bear fruit in lasting change. To be sure, do not set about to make resolutions without relying on His help, but do set about a new beginning as you are called, and see how far the grace of the lord will carry you.

Pastor Harley's Seven Things to Do on a Snow Day

But, if you are home for a snow day, here are some things you might do:

- 1. Build a snowman, even a small one. I have built one every winter since I can remember, and intend to keep doing so. While you are at it, catch a snowflake on your tongue, and there are extra points for making a snow 'angel'! (Proverbs 31:21)
- 2. Find and read all the Bible verses that mention snow. There are twenty-four. (Proverbs 2:1-5)
- 3. Appreciate the Joke in it all. Instead of the water pouring down from the sky and swirling down the storm drains, it becomes solid, and heaps up inconveniently, anywhere and everywhere. This keeps things from becoming monotonous. (Psalm 148:8)
- 4. Scatter food for squirrels, stray cats, birds, wolves, deer and the local Sasquatch. (Sasquatch likes brussels sprouts.) (Job 38:41)
- 5. Enjoy the view. The Bible lifts up snow as an example of all that is clean and shining. Face it, the winter countryside can be a dreary, untidy mess, the snow blankets it all with fresh lines and new shadings. (Psalm 147:16)
- 6. Check on friends and neighbors. Use the telephone to connect. Probably the best thing for humanity would be if we were all snowed up on our streets for a week, and had to get to know the people around us again. Leviticus (19:18)

Your Witness—The Word: God's Oil Change—by Don Gibson

I took our car to have it serviced. Just got back. Among other things, our mechanic will change the oil. Though I'm not a mechanic, I know a couple things about why we do that. Oil lubricates the car and cleans the engine.

In the last week I've been praying/thinking about this article—about how God's Word lubricates and cleans our heart and mind. In other words, remove the Word and we show it readily. Been there/done that. Haven't you? The feeling when the Holy Spirit says "Uh...your low on oil, it's dirty, and you show it in your heart, attitude, intentions, sensitivity, even your activities. So open the Word, Don...and read it!

I hate that feeling. It's not common but I praise God that He reminds me when I let my day get in the way of my relationship with my Lord. I need God's Word daily—even throughout the day. Why? Let's look at the Word. It so clear! "Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin." Psalm 51:2. Wow! Who wouldn't want that? Probably the one who doesn't know a Godly relationship—or somebody running from God. What a reminder to the believer that God is our hope because He cleanses us from our sin—just as our car engines are kept clean from the oil.

As I think of it, that oil stays in the car engine all the time. It's constantly doing its job—as the Bible constantly does its job. We keep the oil drain plug intact and we even check the oil level periodically to maintain our engine. And God provides our Spiritual oil with His Word. He even tells us to maintain it. Look at the benefit—4 "He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully. 4 He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, and righteousness from the God of his salvation." Psalm 24:4-5 Now that takes some real oil, doesn't it. As the saying goes, "God's got it." He lubricates and cleanses us with His Word. Thank you, Lord. Another Psalm… "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow." Psalm 51: 7. Beautiful!

So we blow it once in a while? God's got this, too. "10 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. 11 Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me. 12 Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit." God draws us back. Thank you, Lord God!

There's our witness, fellow Christians! God lubricates us. God cleans us. People see that. And He calls upon us to reveal it and to encourage others with it. It's our witness.


