Gideons is the March Mission of the Month

Broadway purchases Scriptures distributed by The Gideons International locally, and worldwide. Thank you, Broadway!

9 Broadway members currently serve year-round as your local missionaries, along with 265,000 other Gideons and Auxiliary (Gideon wives) worldwide in 199 countries.

The Gideons are a body of believers dedicated to making the Word of God available to everyone and, **together with the local church, reaching souls for Christ.** What began in 1908 as an Association of Christian businessmen placing Bibles in hotel rooms has evolved into an expanding mission to **provide Scriptures to all people in nearly every facet of life.** We exist as **an advocate for the lost,** to bring them the saving knowledge of the Word.



Last week, **shown in the picture,** Ken Harper of the Alliance, Ohio Gideons helped 200 Mexican Gideons distribute 603,4087 Scriptures in Mexico City. Broadway's prayers and funds played a part.

We Gideons also share our personal faith because we realize how often people today need someone to come alongside them in finding their way to true salvation that is available only through the grace of God. As opportunities arise, we take time to share the Gospel message with friends and family, business acquaintances, and other people we meet who are struggling in their daily lives.

Distributing God's Word plants powerful seeds God can use according to His own timing (I Corinthians 3:6), allows many to read the truth for themselves (John 8:32), provides a lasting witness (Hebrews 4:12), and makes it easier for those we reach to boldly spread the Good News (II Timothy 2:2).

As an example Gideon country, the island country of Papua New Guinea in the Pacific is home to nearly 10 million people. 800 of them are Gideons and Auxiliary. The Gideons started in Papua New Guinea in 1980, and have distributed 2 million Scriptures there since then. Again, Broadway's prayers/mission gifts help buy these Scriptures. In Ephesians 5:14, above, he walks us through this gospel-work in our hearts.

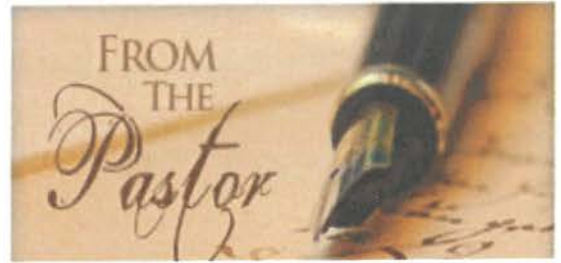

An Important Weapon

“And He withdrew from them about a stone’s throw and He knelt down and began to pray, saying, ‘Father, if Thou are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Thine be done.’ ” Luke 22:41,42

In Jesus’ most desperate hour, He knew He needed to pray to His Father. He wanted His disciples “to keep watching and praying” with Him. Jesus asked for their support because He knew great power is unleashed when together we pray. Besides Scripture, “the sword of the Spirit” (Eph. 6:17) being a weapon against the evil one, prayer is also our weapon. Prayer is a weapon against discouragement, against fear, against worry. Prayer is a way to talk to God about what is on our hearts and minds and ask Him for insight, wisdom and comfort. Jesus often went alone to pray (Mark 1:35) even in His most busy times, as an example for us. He wants us to pray, both individually and together. God has provided an opportunity to pray specifically for our church and our new denomination.

We will meet from 9-10 a.m. on the **last Thursday of the month** in the Church library off of Spencer Fellowship Hall to focus prayer on the revitalization of our Church and the Global Methodist Church as a whole. The topics to be covered in this once-a-month, year-long prayer time will be healing, spiritual warfare, revitalization and maintaining vitality. The format includes a short reading, personal reflection, brief discussion and prayer.

Materials have been provided by the Revitalization Task Force of the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA). The WCA encourages all Global Methodist churches or those considering joining the new denomination to pray. “If our congregations are to be revitalized...even resurrected in some cases, we have to get to create a space where God’s voice can be heard. We must start with prayer.” (From WCA revitalization materials)

We will also continue to meet at 9:00-10:00 AM Thursday in the library for regular prayer meetings. These are more informal times of praise, sharing, and praying for personal and church needs. We have sensed God’s Holy Spirit present and it is a great time of encouragement! All are welcome, whether comfortable praying out loud or in silence. Your Witness—Way to Go, Asbury! You're A Witness - by Don Gibson

Now this is news, I say! **Good News**. Sure beats the typical stuff in the paper, on radio and TV. That February 8th **Asbury University chapel service** is still going strong 12 days later, at least on this newsletter's publication date. You know what? Twelve-day worship services are not the norm. Notice it's not the pastor pushing the limits—it's the worshipers.

Wait! Is there a limit? Where does it say worship has to end in an hour or two. Broadly speaking, maybe our whole lives should be worship. Kinda goes with **1 Thesalonians 5:17** "Pray without ceasing."

Don't you love this? I do! After the February 8th chapel service, a number of students just felt like sticking around afterwards. They worshipped. More returned. And more. Then it went viral. Then Christians came from, says Breitbart News, the University of Kentucky, the University of the Cumberlands, Purdue University, Indiana Wesleyan University, Ohio Christian University, Transylvania University, Midway University, Lee University, Georgetown College, Mt. Vernon Nazarene University, and others. They filled Hughes Auditorium, and their spilling over into additional facilities with simulcasts.

Of course you can see it on Asbury's website. Last report I recall is 3,000 believers came from Kentucky and beyond to worship the Lord God Almighty. It's so big in drawing people to multiple buildings that its shifting off-campus with a schedule instead of being ongoing around the clock.

Here's my point. This is a witness in my book. That's what I like about it. The U.S.A., and even the world are **witnessing** Christ-followers doing round-the-clock worship: singing, praying, Scripture and testimonies—honoring Jesus. **It's real!** No show. No performance. No glitz. I saw a bit of it on TV news. And more on the website. Breitbart News says millions are watching. It seems these worshipers are seeking Christ. They're not there because of duty. They just want to worship. They didn't design and plan it. They didn't line up the media coverage. They're there to worship, as the Spirit leads. It's a witness.

I hope it turns into Psalm 22:27 "*All the ends of the world shall remember and turn unto the LORD: and all the kindreds of the nations shall worship before thee.*"

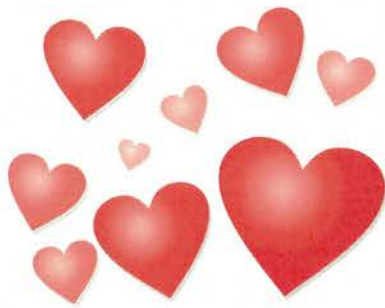

April Mission of the Month-Pastor Elbarre in Haiti

In the summers of 2016-2018, Broadway sent a team of persons to do ministry through Praying Pelican Missions (PPM) at Manze Marie Church located in the mountains of southern Haiti. Pastor Elbarre Saint Juste was the local pastor who identified the needs in the community where we could help. We visited community members, helped build a new school building, repaired homes and provided Vacation Bible School for the children. When we decided not to go back in 2019 due to the dangerous conditions in Haiti, specifically the Port Au Prince area, we sent the funds raised to build a well, conduct medical clinics, provide COVID information and masks and provide fencing for animals they could raise to support the school.

Praying Pelican Missions has begun a new program to provide support to the local pastors they work with since the conditions are still unsafe to send teams to Haiti. The new program is called PPM365 which provides for a local pastor's medical needs, training, and relational support with other Haitian pastors as well as the means for each pastor to do mission within their community.

When I reached out to Anna Morgan, the PPM365 leader, I asked if Pastor Elbarre was part of the program. She said, "Oh yes. We know Pastor Elbarre very well. In fact, he led 70 persons to minister to neighboring towns." She also provided the following information from his profile.

"Pastor Elbarre grew up in a Christian home where his family always taught him to walk in faith. But he never expected God would eventually call him into full-time ministry! When he started, things were not easy, but God taught him patience and entrusted him with more and more as he matured. He has been in full-time ministry since 1988 (35 years), pastoring at Manze Marie since 2008. He and his wife have been married since 2001 and have one child together."

"The church desires to spread the Gospel to their community and be a place for children and families to go for activities and support. They want to continue spreading the love of Jesus with their neighbors and bring up disciples in the church."

Our team members can attest to the fact this church was a hub for the community and they love and respect Pastor Elbarre very much. He has a joyful spirit and we could sense his love for his people.

The Missions Committee has designated Pastor Elbarre to be the **Mission of the Month for April**. Any funds donated over the \$2400 considered full support of the pastor will be used for projects to help the church in their mission to their community. Another local Haitian pastor who is on staff with PPM will work with Pastor Elbarre to identify the projects and dispense the funds as needed. Easter Mission: Tuscarawas County Blessings in a Backpack



Blessings in a Backpack mobilizes communities, individuals, and resources to provide weekend food for New Philadelphia school-aged children who might otherwise go hungry.

Three out of five teachers say they have children in their classrooms who regularly come to school hungry. More than half of teachers (53%) say they purchase food for hungry kids in their classrooms.

On average, \$150 will feed one child on the weekends for one 38-week school year through the Blessings in a Backpack program—the results: nourished kids ready to learn. Food is an essential building block; in this case, it is truly a blessing, especially to a hungry child!

A "hunger cliff" is looming for millions of Americans, with 32 states set to slash food-stamp benefits beginning in March. According to data from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the cuts will impact more than 30 million people enrolled in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. The children in our community will need programs like Blessings in a Backpack even more.
